Proposed Public toilet at Main Street program

Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council (CGRC), identified a need of a public toilet at its main street at Gundagai.

\$5.4 million dollar main street redevelopment is underway for the town's main street (Sheridan Street) which covers three blocks from Otway Street to Virgil Street.

The main objective of the project is the beautification of the town, and revitalizing the business community. Other flow on objectives includes enhancing the green space, incorporation public art and interpretation for the community and visitor to enjoy and improved traffic flow and pedestrian safety. It is anticipated that, this main street after completion will attract most of the commuters out of 10,000 traffic/day, travelling on the Hume highway.

The length of Main Street starting from West Street to Virgil Street is approximately 900m. It takes about 15minutes to walk from one end to the other. Currently, Council has two public toilets; one located at Carberry Park near visitor information centre and another located at the Yarri Park. Though these toilets are within 10minutes walking distance, and are still isolated and located outside the main street. It is obvious that after completion of Main Street, majority of the people will prefer spending most of the time in the main street as it will have ample of car parks and heaps of attractions/activities.

Hence, Council recently identified a need of provision of set of public toilet along this street. The most appropriate location for the public toilet is proposed at the corner of Sheridan Street and Byron Street as shown in the figure 1.2 below. This proposal will be finalized after extensive community consultation.

Estimated cost of construction of toilet block at Main Street is

\$150k
