PUBLIC EXHIBITION OF PROPOSED HERITAGE ITEMS AND CONSERVATION AREAS IN THE COOTAMUNDRA SHIRE

A Local Government Area Community Based Heritage Study of the Cootamundra Shire has been completed by Heritage Architect, Dr Peter Kabaila, for the Cootamundra Shire Council and the NSW Department of Planning.

The Heritage Study has recommended a list of buildings, places and structures in Cootamundra, Stockinbingal and Wallendbeen that should be included as Heritage Items in the new Cootamundra Local Environmental Plan which is currently being prepared for the Cootamundra Shire.

The Study has also recommended that Council adopt Conservation Areas for Cootamundra, Stockinbingal and Wallendbeen.

The Heritage Study, together with the recommended list of Heritage Items and Conservation Areas, will be placed on public exhibition for a period of eight weeks and submissions regarding the proposed Heritage Items and Conservation Areas may be made to Council. Following the conclusion of the public exhibition, the recommended Heritage Item listings and Conservation Areas, together with details regarding any submissions received, will be considered by Council prior to a decision being made on the final list of Heritage Items and the Conservation Areas that will be included in the Local Environmental Plan.
