## **Park Plans on Display**

Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council residents are invited to view the concept plans for the proposed playground to be constructed in Jubilee Park Cootamundra.

The plans will be on display at the Cootamundra and Gundagai administration offices and on the CGRC website. Interested members of the community are invited to comment on the plans until 2 October 2018.

The playground is being constructed under CGRC Stronger Communities Fund Major Project Program. The Stronger Communities Fund is administered by Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council and is an initiative of the NSW State Government.

Structures within the planned playground include shade shelters, picnic tables and barbecues. Existing trees will be retained where possible.

A 'Nature play' separation section will separate toddler and senior play areas and feature smooth rocks and sand pockets. Plans include a possible water integrated explorative play zone. Delineation of areas will feature mulch, Softfall matting, sand and lawn areas.

The existing rotunda will be improved and integrated within new play spaces as a chill out zone and there will be a connection to external footpath links with roadways.

Shade sails, toddler swings, dexterity panels, a SKY RIDER Double Cable Ride, general play areas with swings, play tower structures and a smart play cube are all featured in the concept plan.

Plants will be selected for ease of maintenance and tolerance to site conditions, with the predominance of native species to encourage native fauna and minimise water use.
