

#### PARKS AND GARDENS UPDATE

Staff have completed daily tasks involving CBD Street sweeping, litter removal, mowing, whipper snipping, edging, hand weeding, cleaning barbeques, tree maintenance and actioning on customer requests. Additional works completed included replacement of broken and worn slats from timbers seats in Cootamundra Park areas. Yass Road lane has been trimmed and cleared from the airport end to Mowall Engineering. 6 tree stumps were removed and a



fence was moved to allow better access for caravans parking at the Cootamundra Caravan Park. A large pine tree in Albert Park required complete removal. Staff commenced



post and pickets were installed. The garden beds around Hovell and Hurley Street roundabouts have been mulched. Staff have commenced work on trimming trees for the upcoming re-seal on some of Cootamundra town streets. A large Elm branch fell from a tree in Albert Park and destroyed some park furniture. The branch was cleaned up and the table and chairs were removed.

## COOTAMUNDRA RETURN AND EARN COLLECTION

A reverse vending machine collection point has been installed in Cootamundra ready to exchange eligible drink containers for a 10 cent refund as part of the NSW Government's container deposit scheme Return and Earn. Eligible drink containers include most between 150mls and three litres that are predominately consumed away from home and found in the litter stream. Containers should be empty, uncrushed, unbroken and with the original label attached. The collection point is located in the carpark of the Cootamundra Woolworths. Council supports the introduction of this new litter reduction initiative, however, it is not involved in any way in the operation of the scheme. # AMENITIES BLOCK TAKES SHAPE AT STAN CROWE OVAL

The long awaited amenities facility in Gundagai's Stan Crowe Oval is now becoming a reality. Work has progressed quickly on the building, the blockwork has been completed, roof trusses installed and a building that resembles an amenities block now stands on the site.



Construction workers this week were assembling the steel work that forms part of the spectator shelter and undercover areas. The project is still on schedule for the building to be at lockup stage by end of December with completion being late January.

Council recently took delivery of a new Rosmech Mistral road sweeper replacing the 2008 Rosmech sweeper based in Cootamundra. The unit will be utilised in both Cootamundra and Gundagai to ensure the town's streets are cleaned and presented to a high standard.

# \$1.7 MILLION IN FUNDING ANNOUNCED

Member for Cootamundra Steph Cooke today announced over \$1.7 million in funding for Council as part of the NSW Government's \$200 million *Stronger Country Communities Fund*. Projects included in the \$1.778.938 announcement:

- ♦ Gundagai Playground and Fitness Centre \$300,000.
- ♦ Establishment of a large scale teen playground at Jubilee Park, Cootamundra \$499,900.
- ♦ Establishment of village playgrounds and fitness infrastructure in Nangus, Stockinbingal and Wallendbeen \$375,593.
- ♦ Community fitness infrastructure for community groups \$603,445.



#### ON YOUR BLOCKS!

A grant from the Stronger Communities Fund has assisted The Cootamundra Swimming & Lifesaving Club to upgrade facilities at the Cootamundra War Memorial Swimming Pool. The Swimming Club was successful in gaining a



\$50,000 grant to update training equipment which is used in the local outdoor pool. The starting blocks have been replaced, along with the acquisition of new lane ropes, protection covers and other essential equipment used in the operation of the Club. These improvements will give those in our community that wish to excel at swimming the opportunity to be able to compete with their city competitors on a more even playing field. Stage two of the project involves the updating of the club rooms, which is expected to be completed soon.

## **COUNCIL WORKS TO IMPROVE WATER SERVICES**



The mammoth task of addressing the reticulated water supply in Cootamundra is well underway. Council has so far replaced 1km of old cast iron water pipe in the town. Nearly 19km of the water pipes are old cast/ductile iron showing signs of age and deterioration. For this reason, the rate of failure can be as high as 6 to 7 times per week in summer. This also creates "dirty water" around the entire township. There is significant water loss issues due to extensive flushing required to minimize the dirty

water. Council will spend \$2 million of Stronger Community Fund monies which will accelerate the existing water main replacement program, by many years. Council is using traditional pipe replacement and new technology techniques to deliver the water main replacement program. Council may look at further escalating the full replacement through a borrowing program.

## **ASSET MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP**

A key component of Cootamundra Gundagai Regional Council's long term financial sustainability is the effective management of council assets. With assets valued at over 600 million dollars, CGRC is constantly striving to make improvements to work processes as well as systems used to collect and manage the data that informs decision making. On the 20<sup>th</sup> of December, a workshop was held for staff across Council to provide an update regarding progress on the development of an Asset Register and Strategy but also to plan for the future and ensure a clear understanding how each role across the organisation contributes to effective asset management. Maintaining an effective asset management system isn't simply the domain of engineers and accountants but relies on a 'whole of organisation' contribution including staff from road crews, parks and gardens, building maintenance and development assessment just to name a few. Facilitated by Mike Brearley of Brearley and Hanson and Mark Loaney of OranaSoft, the workshop was well attended by council staff and resulted in clear direction for asset planning in 2018.
