VALERIE PARV was made a Member of the Order of Australia in the 2015 Queen's Birthday Honours List for significant contributions to the arts as a prolific author, and as a role model and mentor. She received the Australian Society of Authors ASA Medal 2014-15, and is one of Australia's most successful authors with more than 29 million copies of her books sold,

translated into 29 languages and as ebooks. The State Library of NSW collects her literary papers as an ongoing project and she mentors new writers through the Valerie Parv Award created in her honour by Romance Writers of Australia. Valerie was made an RWA Honorary Life Member Award in 2016. She holds a master of arts from



Queensland University of Technology, and is the first Australian author to receive a Pioneer Award from RT Book reviews, New York. Valerie has served as an Australia Day Ambassador for the past decade. Valerie is represented by The Tate Gallery.

SANDRA BATES AM was appointed Governing and Artistic Director of Ensemble Theatre in 1986. She has directed more than one hundred productions for the theatre during her 27 years at the helm. Sandra's most recent directing credits include THE ACT, THE GINGERBREAD LADY, WHEN DAD MARRIED FURY, RAIN MAN, RHINESTONE REX AND MISS MONICA, LET THE SUNSHINE, MCREELE, GLORIOUS, RABBIT HOLE, TRYING, THE DRAWER BOY and SIX DANCE LESSONS IN SIX WEEKS which toured throughout Australia in 2007. Sandra has directed 20 David Williamson plays, including 12 Premieres. Other highlights include Arthur Miller's DEATH OF A SALESMAN at the Sydney Opera House which won the Glugs Award for Best Production of 1997. Her production of Miller's THE PRICE was nominated for a Mo Award for Best Theatre Production in 2002 and in 2005 she directed his play A VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE. Sandra was made a Member in the Order of Australia in 2001 and was awarded the Variety Club Heart Award for her contribution to theatre in 2002. In 2005 Sandra was presented with the SBW Foundation Achievement

Award for services to theatre by The Glugs and received The Glugs Award for Best Production of 2006 for SIX DANCE LESSONS IN SIX WEEKS and the 2007 Helpmann Award for Best Regional Touring Production. In 2007 Sandra was presented with the Lifetime Achievement Award by the Sydney Theatre Critics.

GARBAGE CHANGES FOR AUSTRALIA DAY 26 JANUARY 2018 GUNDAGAI AND COOTAMUNDRA

MAINTENANCE WORK ON PRINCE ALFRED BRIDGE, MIDDLETON DRIVE, GUNDAGAI FROM MONDAY 15 JANUARY 2018

The NSW Government is funding this \$475,000 project to improve safety for pedestrians and cyclists. Roads and Maritime Services will carry out the work, which involves replacing sections of the timber footway on the steel section of the bridge and general bridge maintenance. RMS will be working between 7am and 6pm from Monday to Friday and expect to finish the work by the end of April 2018, weather permitting. The bridge will be reduced to one lane for the safety of workers, motorists and pedestrians. Pedestrians will be detoured safely along the roadway during the work. There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe, including lane closures and a reduced speed limit of 40 km/h during working hours. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs. NOTICE TO COOTAMUNDRA RESIDENTS -

Residents are advised that due to the current road works on Temora Street, Murray Street and Quinn Street will be closed to through traffic wishing to travel onto Temora Street. Traffic will be detoured at O'Donnell, Justin and Renehan Streets. Local residents will have access to their residences except from the Temora Street end. These restrictions will be in place during normal working hours and are expected to be in place for next few weeks. Residents will be further contacted as works proceed. OPERATIONS REPORT

Works crews are continuing with maintenance works around the shire. Shoulder grading is underway on Old Gundagai Road and heavy patching along Brungle Road will be trimmed in preparation for sealing. Pavement repairs will commence on Mount Street to repair failed sections of pavement. Cootamundra works crew have been removing fallen timber following last week's storms. Patching crews are undertaking patching to the bitumen shire network as required. Work has recommenced on the Gundagai main street upgrade with continuation of the placement of pavers. Work is underway on replacing the old footpath in Parker Street adjacent to the Sacred Heart School in Cootamundra. Parks & Gardens have been busy after two major storm fronts impacted Cootamundra last week. Crews have cleared blocked roads, lanes and driveways of fallen trees and debris



Staff have line marked the four touch football

fields at Nicholson Park and two fields at Fisher Park for the touch football carnival held in Cootamundra on the weekend. Additional works for the event included pressure washing the Fisher Park Grandstand, filling in low points with top soil along with marking the water main at Nicholson Park. The airport was mowed for the planes and gliders that are still using the Cootamundra airport.
