

STRONGER COUNTRY COMMUNITIES FUND ROUND TWO

Round 2 funding of \$200 Million has been announced with applications open now and closing 4 May 2018. Only Council is eligible to apply for this funding and 50% of the allocation of \$2.83M needs to be expended on sporting infrastructure. Individual projects need to be a minimum of \$50,000 and must have demonstrated support from the community. Council will accept applications until Friday 13 April 2018 to allow for reporting to the April Council meeting. Council will be responsible for ranking projects in order of priority.



GUNDAGAI FLOODPLAIN RISK MANAGEMENT STUDY AND PLAN—COMMUNITY CONSULTATION PERIOD—5 MARCH 2018—4 APRIL 2018

Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council is currently undertaking the Gundagai Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan (FRMS&P). This study identifies and assesses potential flood risk mitigation options for Gundagai to improve how flooding can be managed. Council has engaged flooding and hydrology experts, WMAwater, to assist in the assessment of suggested mitigation options. As part of the FRMS&P, Council is seeking input from the community to assist in identifying flooding hot spots, and suggest potential mitigation works that could reduce the flood risk in these areas. CHANGING RURAL LAND TENURE

Rural holdings across former Cootamundra and Gundagai Shires vary greatly, with the larger cropping holdings more often found in the former Cootamundra Shire and smaller market garden and grazing lots filling the former Gundagai Shire. Land is tightly held in our local government area, with reliable rainfall and good soil making this a desirable place to start an agricultural enterprise or to relocate. Judy Boyd has been with Landmark in Cootamundra for 25 years and has noticed some interesting trends evolve over that time. There has been a definite increase in larger holdings being targeted by corporations when they come onto the market, however a lot of land transactions occur between neighbours and so there is a clear trend of contraction and expansion of holdings over the years. Recent trends in tree changers have seen a greater demand for 5 to 50 acre lots on the outskirts of the towns. From a planning perspective, this needs to be carefully managed - too small and services such as water and sealed roads are required and too large for services, but smaller than what is required to derive an income and you often find weeds become an issue. Analysis of whether residential lots are the best use of the land is also a consideration, with quality farm land becoming scarcer. STOCKINBINGAL MEETING TO DISCUSS FUTURE PLANS

The village of Stockinbingal will host a high level meeting on 29 March 2018 with Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council Councillors, senior council

with Cootamundra-Gundagai officers and Stockinbingal community leaders to discuss matters arising from the consultation and formulation of the Villages Strategy. Items on the agenda will include, a progress report on the resealing of Burley Griffin Way and rest area. The Stronger Country Communities Grant which



will see an expansion of the playground and installation of a BMX pump track. Discussion will be encouraged on improvements and upgrades to Stockinbingal's historic Ellwood's Hall. The agenda will also touch on some exciting plans for the village such as plans for the use of the council site in Hibernia Street. If time allows discussions will also be open on the Inland Rail development and proposed rezoning of the village. Council has introduced a dedicated employee who will be responsible for maintenance around villages dealing with issues—such as weed control, regular mowing and other maintenance. All interested community members are invited to attend the meeting to be held in Ellwood's Hall at 5pm on Thursday 29th March 2018.

OPERATIONS REPORT

The Temora Street rehabilitation project between Parker and Murray Streets is complete with only line marking left to be finished. A final seal will be placed on the previous works between Murray and Crown Streets next week. This project was funded under the Roads to Recovery Program. Road maintenance works around the shire over the next week will involve shoulder grading on various roads as well as heavy patching on Nangus Road. Work is currently underway on the rehabilitation of Sheridan Street between Otway Street and the Visitor Information centre. This work is a continuation of the main street project and in preparation for the final resurfacing of the Sheridan Street. Work on the rehabilitation of the Burley Griffin Way through Stockinbingal has commenced. Initial works have included clearing of trees and installation of drainage pipes. Over the coming weeks the drainage works will be complete and earthworks will commence on the rehabilitation of the road pavement. This work is being funded by the Roads and Maritime Services. Works on installing a new culvert across Berthong Road has seen the culvert installed with some minor works yet to be completed on the headwalls. A new culvert has also been installed across West Jindalee Road near the railway crossing to assist with drainage in that area. These works are part of the flood restoration works as approved following the 2016 flooding event. Council's sealing contractor Boral still has more rural roads and town streets in the Cootamundra area to finish off in the current program. These are expected to be completed prior to the end of March. Patching crews are undertaking patching to the bitumen shire network as required. The next section of footpath replacement in Cooper Street adjacent to the Council offices is due to commence next week. This work is being funded from the Stronger Communities funds and is part of the allocation for footpath repairs allocated to both Cootamundra and Gundagai. Parks & Gardens staff are currently preparing for the removal of old annuals and roses. Once this is complete new annuals will be planted and gardens finalised. This project will be completed by the end March.
