The new lighting will be a welcome addition for agents, truck drivers and those who need to use the yards at night. The new lights will be more energy efficient which is ultimately cost effective and environmentally friendly. The electrical upgrade will allow for increased power needs into the future, address safety hazards and improve the overall quality of the electrical system.


#### **OPERATIONS REPORT**

Work is progressing well on the Burley Griffin Way upgrade through Stockinbingal. Last week saw the western end of the project bitumen sealed and the eastern end stabilised with lime. Council will be carting in gravel for the final layer of road pavement and compacting and grading to levels over the next two weeks in preparation for bitumen sealing in June. The sealing will be followed by safety barrier and line marking works and the installation of signage. Kerb and gutter and pipe drainage work will also be completed over the next two weeks. Council wishes to thank residents for their patience and co-operation during the works and request that motorists continue to follow the directions of traffic controllers. The Shed Creek Bridge on Three Ways Road is once again open to traffic. Replacement of the guard rail is still pending availability of contractor. Speed restrictions will still apply until the guard rail is replaced. Stabilising work is now underway on Muttama Road with repairs taking place



along various section of this road. These areas will include patches on Brawlin Hill as well as other prioritised pavement failures. While these works are underway, traffic will be under traffic control with some short delays expected. Maintenance grading is now underway on gravel roads in the Mundarlo area. Work has commenced on the construction of Rathmells Lane. Initial work has seen the widening of culverts and protection of the gas main with buried concrete slabs. Several trees will be removed to accommodate the new road alignment. Parks staff installed a new slab and seat in Albert Park. Damaged slats were replaced on a seat along the bird walk in Muttama Creek. Annuals have been

planted in the post office garden. The bare area of lawn out the front of the Cootamundra library has been seeded, top dressed and watered. 6 more seats were broken at the Fisher Park grandstand and have been replaced. The lighting at the
