SALEYARDS FOCUS ON MEN'S HEALTH

The conversations around the fire buckets Cootamundra Saleyards weren't just about the overnight rain and the condition of sheep being yarded. As a few warmed themselves, others were taking part in an exercise that could potentially save their lives. The Men's Health Education Rural Van (Mherv) was visiting and those gathered were taking advantage of a 10 minute health check. Affectionately called Mherv, the initiative of shining a light on men's health was supported by Council and Saleyards Manager Jeff White. The Saleyards is a meeting place for local men, not just farmers to meet and have a chat. 18 men visit Mherv in the three hours the van was located at the Saleyards. The health check with Mherv is completely free and a community service supported by Rotary. The Rotary Club of Cootamundra organised the visit. Mherv was located in Parker Street outside the Westpac Bank on Tuesday with 31 men visiting. The non-invasive group of tests is undertaken by a registered nurse.

Work is progressing on the Burley Griffin Way upgrade through Stockinbingal. The middle section through the township has now been sealed, with the final section from Stockinbingal Road heading into town due to be sealed by Friday 22 June 2018. Once all sealing has been completed, replacement of the guardrail, line marking and guideposts will commence. Stabilising works are now complete on Muttama Road which has seen pavement repairs along various sections of this road. At the time of writing, the works on Brawlin Hill have been sealed. The section near



'Weventure' was unable to be sealed at the same time due to some reworking required as a result of recent rain. Sealing will now take place as soon as practical. Final linemarking is scheduled for late June. Bitumen road maintenance including patching is being undertaken on roads around the area as required. Work is underway on the construction of Rathmells Lane. Work presently involves cutting and shaping the existing road to the new alignment and compacting the sub-grade material. This project is being funded from the Stronger Community funds. Culverts have now been placed in Pinkerton Road just east of the railway crossing. These culverts are to fill in the open channel and improve drainage along this area. The replacement of kerb and gutter is currently underway in Ursula Street between Hurley Street and Southee Circle. This section was prioritised for repair due to its poor condition following damage from tree roots and concrete deterioration. Works are underway backfilling around the culvert extensions on Nangus Road just east of Nangus. Maintenance grading is underway on gravel roads in the Tumblong area. Work will commence on upgrading access roads to the Gundagai Sewerage Treatment plant in preparation for the upgrading of the plant.

RECONCILIATION WEEK 2018—MURAL UNVEILING

Reconciliation Week 2018 in Cootamundra was marked with the unveiling of a mural in Cootamundra's Apex Park. The mural was created by artist Amanda Levitt and depicts the community coming together, walking hand in hand, and building friendships and social inclusion. The circle represents the sun (yellow) and the travel lines running off the sun represent the land (brown) and the crops (green). Council was extremely pleased to partner with Ability Links and the indigenous community on this wonderful project and hopes to be able to build on this partnership into the future. The ceremony commenced with Kobi Russell playing a piece on the digeridoo, with Elders Uncle Roy Levitt and Donny Elphick delivered the welcome to country. The mural is on display for the community to enjoy at Apex Park facilities building.

COOTAMUNDRA WATER MAIN REPLACEMENT - Council has previously identified the urgent need to replace 60 year old water mains in Cootamundra. The estimated cost of the replacement is in excess of \$5 million. Council will initially spend \$2 million of Stronger Community Fund monies and will be considering further escalating a full replacement of the old mains system through a borrowing program. The tender for Cootamundra town water main replacement, has been loaded onto TenderLink and advertised externally. The tender was emailed to over 2000 prospective contractors. A pre-tender meeting was held in Cootamundra on Thursday 31 May, with representatives from eleven specialist companies coming together to scope the project. Attendance by Tenderers was mandatory to be considered eligible for award of the contract. Tenders close Wednesday 20 June at 4pm.

After an extensive period of consultation and the endorsement of the "Our Place, Our Future" Community Strategic Plan 2018-28 on 10 April 2018, Council wishes to notify all residents, community members and interested parties that the draft 2018/19 Operational Plan and draft 2018/19 - 2020/21 Delivery Program have been prepared and are now presented to the community for comment. The Operational Plan details the actions to be undertaken during the next financial year and includes the annual budget, revenue policy and fees and charges for the year ahead. The Delivery Program details the activities the Council will deliver over its term, the strategies it will implement in consultation with the community and contained in the Community Strategic Plan, and the measures used to determine success. All residents, community members and interested parties are invited to view the draft Operational Plan and Delivery Program and provide comment. The document is available online at www.cgrc.nsw.gov.au and at Council's administration offices and libraries. The draft Operational Plan and Delivery Program will remain on public exhibition until 5pm 19 June 2018 and submissions can be made via the following: Online, by mail, by email, by fax. Submissions received will be considered by Council before the plans or amendments are adopted by Council at the next Ordinary Meeting of Council on 26 June 2018.
