

progressed along to Nanangroe Road with a second crew on Tarrabandra Road. Bitumen shire road maintenance, including patching, is being undertaken on roads around the Council area as required.

Footpath works on Boundary Road near Hurley Street are continuing. The crew also replaced a section of footpath in Bourke Street between Cooper and Parker Street. Footpath works are also underway in Punch Street in Gundagai. These footpath projects are being funded from the Stronger Communities Funds. Work is progressing on the construction of Rathmells Lane. Most of the new gravel pavement material has now

been placed and compacted. Crews are currently working on turning lanes on Stockinbingal Road to allow vehicles to safely turn into Rathmells lane. Bitumen sealing is scheduled to take place in early August. Earthworks are also progressing on preparation works at the Gundagai Sewerage Treatment Plant. The first causeway in Nashs Lane has now seen a new concrete road deck constructed. The second causeway repairs over Muttama Creek are expected to be undertaken between Friday 27 July 2018

and Monday 30 July 2018. This will require a further closure of Nashs Lane. Traffic will detour via Cowcumbla/Hovell Streets and Back Brawlin Road. Two swing seats have been replaced at Nicholson Park and one swing seat was replaced at Kingston Park

by Parks and Gardens Staff. The garden beds at Jubilee Park were weeded and



mulched and the Captains heads were cleaned. Three standard roses have been replaced in the rose garden at Albert Park. The soil in the Adams /Parker Street roundabout was removed and replenished along with new annuals planted. The old tree





stumps and guards were removed from the stadium carpark and new trees and guards were installed. The shoulder press machine located with the exercise equipment in Bourke Street has been repaired.
