## \$6 MILLION IN FUNDING DELIVERED TO HELP COOTAMUNDRA-GUNDAGAI THRIVE



Member for Cootamundra Steph Cooke announced \$1.9 million in funding to enhance Council. Over \$1.9 million has been committed to finance administrative costs such as the development of unified Strategic Plans for tourism, the environment and economic development as well as harmonising accounting systems. The \$3.88 million funding package includes: \$1.35 million for the Cootamundra Country Club to complete upgrades to the precinct including dam, machinery shed, course and building façade; Over \$500,000 for capital works projects to expand Gundagai Preschool; \$60,000 for general repairs and installation of heating and cooling at Ellwood Hall (Stockinbingal); \$200,000 for relining and installing a new kitchen at the Coolac Hall, and the installation of cricket nets, picket fence, irrigation and seating at the Oval; \$130,000 to upgrade the tennis courts and install a community BBQ at

Adjungbilly Hall; Over \$50,000 for Cootamundra Harness Racing to undertake track maintenance and upgrades; \$100,000 for the Cootamundra Mens Shed to relocate to Depot 2 on Hovell Street; \$450,000 for four new netball courts at Cootamundra; \$200,000 for the Mill Centre Interactive Tourist Attraction; \$40,000 for a river water pump to Gundagai Sportsfields; \$150,000 for new lighting at the Gundagai Sportsground; \$30,000 toward community facilities, multipurpose courts and BBQ area at Tumblong; Over \$20,000 for the installation of permanent storage sheds to support Battle of the Bidgee event; Over \$50,000 to install solar panels and help reduce costs at the Cootamundra Nursing Home; \$60,000 for a sensory garden at Gundagai South Public School; \$75,100 to install soft fall at the playground at Gundagai Public School; \$10,000 for a new PA system for Gundagai Junior Rugby League; \$30,000 for a disabled toilet at Town & Country Inc; \$50,000 to develop the Gundagai Main Street History walk; \$25,000 for the Gundagai RSL towards landscaping Anzac Grove Gundagai RSL; \$130,000 for basketball courts, new amenities at the Yarri Park Youth precinct/Lions Park; \$150,000 for Cootamundra Rugby Union Club for new dressing room facilities and club room and; Over \$3,000 to install a disabled access ramp at the Cootamundra Arts Centre.

Parks & Gardens staff have installed a water filling station near the Cootamundra library. The public can now fill up their mater bottles, drink from the bubbler and give their pets a drink from the dog dish. A baby swing seat has been replaced at Cameron Square. Staff have been weeding and mulching garden beds. Event bins were delivered to the airport for



the vintage car club event. Annuals in the CBD were liquid fertilised. A broken spring rocker at Harold Conkey Park has been replaced. Winter street tree planting has commenced. Parks staff assisted with moving office furniture as part of the opening of the office upgrade in Cootamundra. Building maintenance jobs have been completed including repairing the door at the heritage centre, replacing seals and rubbers at the Fisher Park toilets, boarding up holes and broken windows at the old hospital to keep the pigeons out, and fixing the net at the sports stadium. Suckers growing in the fence at the Cootamundra showground have been cut and removed. Palmer Park trees have received a canopy lift and a fresh bed of mulch. Weed spraying has been undertaken. Vegetation trimming over footpaths and trimming of low branches over the Janeways has continued allowing for safer access for nedestrians an

low branches over the laneways has continued allowing for safer access for pedestrians and better access for the garbage truck and other high vehicles. The area between the creek and the footpath along Yarri Park and Haydon Park has been pruned, mown and mulched. Garden beds next to Carberry Park have been pruned, weeded and re-mulched. Pruning of roses has been undertaken. Essential Energy will begin vegetation management work in the

Cootamundra town area this month to maintain minimum powerline clearances and ensure the ongoing safety and reliability of the local electricity network. Essential Energy's cyclical vegetation management program ensures minimum safety clearances are maintained between trees and overhead powerlines and helps to minimise the trimming required in the future, while also maintaining a reliable power supply. Works will be undertaken by Asplundah, Essential Energy approved contractors, who are qualified in all aspects of vegetation management. Contractors use directional pruning techniques that remove branches growing towards a powerline and encourage regrowth away from the power network. Whilst this can affect visual amenity, these techniques are considered best practice throughout the arboriculture industry and are used by most power companies in Australia. Weather permitting, the vegetation work will carried out in during August. For further

information please contact Essential Energy on 13 20 80. Works staff are nearing completion on shoulder widening along Yeo Yeo Hampstead Road. Crews have been trimming in preparation for sealing in early August. This work is being funded from the Roads to Recovery Program. Sealing of Rathmells lane and associated turning lanes from Stockinbingal Road was completed last week. Minor tidy up works including guide posts and signs will be carried out on both these projects as soon as practical. Maintenance grading is underway on Nanagroe Road and will progress towards Parsons Creek Road over the next week. Other grading crews will be completing the RSL carpark in Gundagai and then moving to Rosedale Road. Bitumen shire road maintenance continues around the shire area as required. Footpath works on Boundary Road near Hurley Street are progressing. Footpath works in Punch Street Gundagai are expected to be completed this week. Work will then commence in Byron Street. These footpath projects are being funded from the Stronger Communities Funds. Earthworks are continuing at the Gundagai Sewerage Treatment Plant. Work has now commenced on the second causeway in Nashs Lane with the middle portion of the concrete road deck now constructed. The remainder of this causeway repair is expected to be undertaken between Friday 10 August 2018 to Monday 13 August 2018. This work will require closure of Nashs Lane during these dates. Traffic will detour via Cowcumbla/Hovell Streets and Back Brawlin Road. Any inconvenience is regretted.

## **BPAY FOR GUNDAGAI RATEPAYERS**

Ratepayers in the former Gundagai Shire Council area are now able to pay their rates and / or water accounts via BPay. To facilitate this, it was necessary for Council to change the format of Assessment numbers to a uniform length. Ratepayers will notice the new numbers on their 2018/19 rate notice, to be issued in July 2018. How it works Step 1: Locate the BPay logo on your notice. Step 2: Log on to your online banking-Choose the BPay payment option. Step 3: Enter the payment details-Enter the BPay Biller code, Customer Reference Number and amount you are paying. Step 4: Click Pay—Your bill payment is now complete. It is important to ensure that you use the correct reference number so your payment can be allocated to the relevant account (either rates or water).
