James (Yarri) McDonnell and John (Jacky Jacky) Morley have been posthumously recognised for their efforts in rescuing 68 people in Gundagai from floodwaters in June 1852. A total of 89 people died in the floods. A statue of the men proudly stands in the main street of Gundagai.

## **COOLAC CEMETERY GATES**

The entrance to the Coolac Cemetery has undergone a massive transformation with the installation of a set of decorative gates. The original gates and entrance were damaged a number of years ago, with the brick pillars on either side of the entrance crumbling and broken. Killard Infrastructure has been awarded the \$2 million contract to renew Cootamundra's ageing cast and ductile water mains. General Manager Lee Edwards said the team is looking forward to starting the project and is keen to become a part of the Cootamundra community during their time in the town. The project funding has been sourced from the Stronger Communities Fund, an initiative of the NSW Government and administered by Council.

COOTAMUNDRA SWIMMING POOL PATRONS ARE ADVISED PUBLIC HOURS WILL BE LIMITED FOR A TWO WEEK PERIOD TO ALLOW LOCAL SCHOOLS TO CARRY OUT INTENSIVE SWIM SCHOOL PROGRAMS. FROM MONDAY 17 SEPTEMBER 2018 UP TO AND INCLUDING FRIDAY 29 SEPTEMBER 2018 THERE WILL BE NO LUNCHTIME PUBLIC HOURS. PUBLIC HOURS WILL BE BETWEEN 6.30AM AND 8.00AM; AND 3.30PM AND 7.00PM. APOLOGIES FOR ANY INCONVENIENCE.

OPERATIONS REPORT—Work is continuing on the Truck wash upgrade at the Cootamundra Saleyards. Initial works have seen old pond areas excavated in preparation for construction of the new concrete holding basins. Funding for this project is from the 'Fixing Country Truck Washes Program'. While these works are underway the truck wash facilities will be closed. Maintenance grading has been completed on Stockdale, Shultz, Hopewood, Cooininee, Racecourse, and Forsyth's Roads. Other grading crews are working in the Yannawah, Brawlin, and Rosedale Road areas as conditions permit. Bitumen shire road maintenance continues throughout the Council area as required. Replacement of the timber bridge on Edwards Town Road is now complete with the road reopened. The bridge contractor is currently installing piles for the Fishing Jetty on Morley's Creek. Footpath works are underway on both the Boundary Road and Byron Street projects. These footpath projects are being funded from the Stronger Communities Fund. Earthworks also progressing on the preparation works at the Gundagai Sewerage Treatment Plant. The Interflow crews are currently in Cootamundra undertaking the next



stage of CCTV analysis of the underground sewer network. Currently crews are working north of Temora Street and Council will advise residents via a letterbox drop when they are in their area. Work is progressing on the second causeway in Nashs Lane. The last section of the concrete deck has now been poured. Some delays were experienced with this project however the road should be reopened early next week. Parks staff have continued with maintenance of gardens with weeding, pruning and mulching taking place. Roses at the Stockinbingal War Memorial were fertilised, the rose garden at Albert Park has been weeded and freshly mulched and repairs have been made to some broken irrigation lines. This year marks 100 years of Lions Club with the milestone being marked by a tree



planting in Albert Park which is marked with a commemorative plaque. Staff have continued to plant new street trees around the Cootamundra, Wallendbeen and Stockinbingal areas. Event bins were delivered to Wallendbeen Recreation Ground for the Junior Rugby Union presentations. Staff ensured Fisher Park was ready for the Wattle Time Fair and Book Week Parade. A further three seats were replaced following vandalism to the Fisher Park Grandstand. Building maintenance work was carried out to Council buildings in Stockinbingal and the Cootamundra Saleyards.

KERBSITE GREEN WASTE COLLECTION—COOTAMUNDRA Green waste, placed neatly stacked, without obstruction to pedestrians, in front of your residence (not laneways) the week starting Sunday 9 September 2018 and will be collected on the same day as your normal garbage service for this week only. (If your green waste has not been collected on your garbage day, leave it kerbside as it will be collected by the end of the week) All loose waste must be secured with string or placed in cardboard boxes. Plastic bags are not to be utilised and will not be collected.

The following items are not eligible and WILL NOT be collected:

- Waste items longer than 2 metres
- Waste that requires more than two people to collect (e.g. over 50 kg)
- Normal household waste items eg bottles, cardboard, paper, aluminium and steel cans. cardboard
- Trade, commercial, industrial or shop waste of any kind including building waste
- Rocks, soil, asbestos, barb wire, plate glass or builders waste
- Home renovation timber waste
- Motor vehicle chassis or parts
- Any large vehicle or machinery parts including tyres
- Poisons, oils, pesticides or other chemical, liquid waste, inflammable materials, paints and gas cylinders

### **NEW TRUCK WASH AT COOTAMUNDRA SALEYARDS**

The new facility will use recycled water, reduce water usage and have the capacity to wash two trucks at a time.

The truck washing facility remains closed for approximately 12 weeks to allow works to proceed on the new state of the art facility. Funding for the \$330,000 project has come from the Australian Federal Government, NSW State Government and Council.
