WORK ON PLANT CONTINUES

GUNDAGAI

Earthworks on Gundagai's new sewerage treatment plant have progressed with the installation of a large embankment constructed to house the sewerage treatment plant buildings. The embankment has been built by Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council employees to a height 200mm above the 100 year flood level to ensure the buildings are safe from the impact of flood in the future. Soil from the Gundagai main street rejuvenation project has been recycled to allow the pad to be constructed. The replacement of the treatment works is being made possible with funds from the Australian Federal Government, the NSW State Government and Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council.

COOTAMUNDRA SALEYARDS IMPROVEMENTS

Member for Cootamundra Steph Cooke MP called into the Cootamundra Saleyards recently. Ms Cooke was accompanied by General Manager Allen Dwyer and CGRC Saleyards Manager Jeff White. Ms Cooke inspected the new truck wash site under construction and was briefed on the progress of the lighting and electrical upgrade project also currently underway. The new truck wash facility will use recycled water, reduce water usage and have the capacity to wash two trucks at a time. State of the art technology will also be implemented to monitor use of the facility off site. The existing services needed improvements to meet the demands of the industry. The lighting and electrical upgrade project, funded from the NSW Government initiative The Stronger Communities Fund and administered by the Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council, is being undertaken in conjunction with the truck wash facility.



OPERATIONS REPORT Construction work is underway on the Truck wash upgrade at the Cootamundra Saleyards. Contractors are currently preparing for the new concrete holding basins. Funding for this project is from the 'Fixing Country Truck Washes Program'. While these works are underway the truck wash facilities will be closed. Works crews in Cootamundra have commenced roadworks in Yass Road adjacent to the new



fuel depot. Initial works will see the construction of new kerb along Yass Road up to Rodeo Drive. Other works involve the excavation and reconstruction of the road shoulders in order to provide turning lanes into the fuel depot. While these works are underway, motorists are asked to following the traffic control directions including 40km/hr speed limit. Maintenance grading has been completed in the Stockinbingal and Berthong areas. Crews are now working on Cooininee, Snowball, and Brawlin Roads. Over the next few weeks works are expected to move to the Yammatree and Wallendbeen areas as conditions permit. Work on repairing the Nashs Lane causeways is now complete. Bitumen shire road

maintenance continues around the shire area as required. Weed spraying is underway along various bitumen shire roads. Installing the decking timbers on the new Morley's Creek fishing jetting has commenced. The footpath works on Boundary Road between Hurley Street and Sheahan Street is now complete. Work on the Byron Street footpath in Gundagai is still progressing. These footpath projects are being funded from the Stronger Communities Funds. Work at the Gundagai Sewerage Treatment Plant is now focussed on the placement

of erosion protection along the pond banks. Parks and Gardens Staff in Cootamundra and Gundagai have been tree trimming, footpath sweeping, emptying street and park bins and mowing. New street tree plantings are complete



for the 2018 planting schedule. Staff in Cootamundra removed three advanced pear trees from the Arts Centre car park and have relocated them to Barry Grace Oval in Wallendbeen. Gundagai staff have cleared the fallen and dead trees along the creek bank on Nangus Road as well as mowing and whipper snipping to tidy the area. Staff have



commenced trimming of trees at the Cootamundra Caravan Park. Weeding and mulching of garden beds is continuing, along with weeding and general maintenance to keep garden beds in the CBD and parks in good condition. The footpath sweeper has been travelling from Cootamundra to Gundagai two days a week to sweep the main street and CBD area. Parks staff in Cootamundra have been assembling the new seating for the

Cootamundra Pool. This will provide plenty of seating under the new shade sails for the upcoming summer swimming season. Repairs have been made at Albert Park and Harold Conkey Park after reports of vandalism. A broken seat at Nicholson Park was also repaired. New netball posts

have been installed at Nicholson Park. The new posts are removable to allow the area to also be used by Junior Rugby League. With the soccer season now at a close the soccer goal posts have been removed from Owen Vincent Oval. Parks staff have been carrying out maintenance work in Gundagai's main street. As part of this maintenance the handrails have been cleaned and polished. The bins and street furniture have also been re-stained.
