ADJUNGBILLY ROAD



Work on the Gobarralong-Adjungbilly Road is well ahead of the scheduled June 2020 completion date. Work commenced on the \$2.1 million project in October 2018. A total of 72,000 cubic metres of material will be excavated to upgrade the road at Adjungbilly Hill to allow for better access for B-Doubles and long vehicles. 21,000 cubic metres will be used for fill in the project and the balance will be stockpiled for future use by Council. All the pavement material (gravel) approximately 7,200 cubic metres, will be sourced from the excavation site. The length of the new road is 2,600 metres and width has been widened to 7.2 metres, 2 standard lanes. The revised completion date will be the end

September, 2019. The project focuses on the winding, narrow and steep curves of the Adjungbilly Hill section addressing the difficulty long vehicles including school buses have negotiating this section. The project will also deliver benefits to the quarry and pine timber industries allowing both industries the opportunity to expand and utilise their carrying capacity with direct access to the Hume Highway.

CGRC INVESTIGATIONS—In the interest of transparency Council wishes to provided residents with an update on the current Investigations into Councils finances and General Manager, Allen Dwyer. ICAC and the Office of Local Government have carried out investigations. Council has now engaged an independent Investigator and lawyers to assist Council with the matter. Council reiterate this investigation is not a presumption of wrong doing by the General Manager and no part of the investigation has been referred to NSW Police. Council thanks residents for their patience with this matter and advise further information will be forthcoming once the investigation is concluded.

OPERATIONS REPORT Gravel road resheeting is underway on Hillbank Road and maintenance grading has commenced on North Jindalee Road. Works are nearing completion with the rehabilitation of Red Hill Rd, sealing is scheduled to commence soon. The crew will then move to Nanangroe Road and Parsons Creek Road. Preliminary works on Gobarralong Road have commenced with culvert cleaning and shoulder being graded. Repairs to the flood causeway on Yeo Yeo Hampstead Road are almost complete with only minor works and installation of the flood gate remaining. Works have involved reconstructing the downstream bank protection and strengthening the road shoulder to reduce the risk of damage and washouts in future high water flows. Work is continuing on Berthong

Road shoulders repairs. The footpath renewal program is progressing, works have been completed at Punch, Byron and Virgil Streets. Homer Street is in progress, work will then proceed on the western end of Sheridan Street. Additional Footpath repairs and replacement works are underway in Yass Road and will move onto Temora Street in the coming weeks. Repairs have been completed to the Harold Conkey Walkway. Maintenance grading is underway on West Jindalee Road. Maintenance patching and weed spraying is being carried out as required and as conditions permit. Maintenance of town signage and delineation is underway around the townships and villages. Council's resealing contractor Boral is nearing completion of the annual resealing program on bitumen roads and streets throughout the council area. The Cootamundra Ex-Services Club carpark is to be resealed in



the current resealing program with the Club contributing to sealing their portion of the carpark and Council the access roadway from Wallendoon Street. Due to the continued warmer weather Council's Parks & Gardens staff continue to water parks, sporting fields and newly planted street trees. Tree work has included removal of fallen branches, and tree trimming along gravel roads to allow access for high machinery passing through these areas. In conjunction with the RSL Sub Branch and due to the failing health of the original Lone Pine, the memorial plaque in Albert Park has been relocated to the site of the newly planted replacement tree. The replacement Lone



Pine was sourced through the Australian War Memorial. Further works completed include delivery and pick up of event bins from events Jubilee Park and the Cootamundra Racecourse and line marking at various sporting fields including Fisher Park for the

commencement of the rugby league season. The grandstand was pressure washed in preparation for the Club's first trial match on the home ground. The Pump Track project at Stockinbingal has now been completed and is proving popular with local children. The pump track was completed as part of NSW State Government Funding. Maintenance to public toilet

Government Funding. Maintenance to public toilet blocks has been completed. Park seats have been painted as part of the maintenance schedule.

Maintenance works were carried out to the airport terminal building.
