COOTAMUNDRA FLOOD STUDY

Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council has appointed WMAwater to undertake a detailed Flood Study for Cootamundra. Once completed, the Cootamundra Flood Study will give Council a better understanding of the current flood risk to the community and support a range of Council functions including development, planning, community education and mitigation works.

The Floodplain Management Process

This project is supported by the NSW Government's Floodplain Management Program which aims to reduce the impacts of flooding and flood liability on individual owners and occupiers, and to minimise private and public losses resulting from flooding. Under the Program, local government is responsible for managing flood liable land.

The Program, through the Floodplain Management Process, encourages the development of solutions to existing flood problems in developed areas, and strategies for ensuring that new development:

- is compatible with the flood hazard, and
- does not create additional flooding problems in existing developed areas.

Data Collection Flood Study Fl

Consultation Period: 10th July – 14th August 2019

Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council is undertaking the Cootamundra Flood Study. The Flood Study is based on current flood modelling techniques and industry guidance, and once completed, will give Council a better understanding of the current flood risk to the community. The outcomes of the Flood Study will support many Council functions including planning and development, community education and designing flood risk mitigation works. Council has engaged flooding and hydrology experts, WMAwater, to complete the study. Council is seeking input from the community to assist in the development of computer models that simulate flood behaviour. In particular, we are interested in collecting records of flooding such as photographs, flood marks (e.g. mud or debris lines), and learning about your experiences of flood behaviour in Cootamundra. 

New fencing is being installed to protect players and passing traffic. A new toilet block is being installed and diseased trees have been removed to make way for new tree plantings. The iconic front entrance will see garden beds installed and another dedicated junior rugby league field created.

will be held on Tuesday 30 July 2019 in the Council Chambers, Gundagai. Members of the public are invited to address Council on any local government issue at the commencement of the meeting.

WORKS REPORT

Work on the Justin Street kerb replacement has now seen kerb along both sides of the street replaced. Final tidy work on the kerb returns into Parker and Murray Streets should be completed by the 3rd week of July. Pavement repairs and resealing along the kerb will take place once the road base has consolidated. Work on Turners Lane causeway has seen the road approaches constructed in preparation for sealing. This project is being funded from the Roads To Recovery Program. Preliminary work is still progressing on a section of Old Gundagai Road. Currently culvert extensions are underway with some batter trimming and shoulder works to take place over the next couple of weeks. This project is also being funded from the Roads To Recovery Program. Maintenance grading and gravel resheeting is continuing on Brawlin Road and Back Brawlin Roads. Shoulder grading along Old Cootamundra Road has been progressing with the crew now around the Lagoon Creek area. Replacement of the old footpath along the southern side of Temora Street between Parker and Murray Streets is expected to commence the week of 15 July. This work was identified as requiring replacement due to its poor condition and has been funded from the Stronger Communities Grants. Patching works on town streets and bitumen shire roads is continuing as required.
