

The Cootamundra Water Main Replacement Project is progressing well with 19.5 kilometres of new water main installed. Contractors for the project Killard Excavations predict the project will be complete by January 2020. Installation of a new water outlet pipe and valve has been installed at the reservoir behind Carool Road. A multipurpose shed for Gundagai's Golf Club, Tennis Club and Bowling Club is almost complete. The shed will be used to house equipment, electric golf buggies and will also have toilets and a kitchen facility for future events. Work continues on a new building for Cootamundra Australian Rules Football Club. The new facilities will incorporate Club Rooms, Kitchen, Interior Public Toilets and Change Room Facilities and be a modern hall which can be utilised by all sporting groups or community members. This year's summer swimming season, will bring a new and exciting chapter for both Cootamundra and Gundagai Swimming Pools. The Gundagai Pool has been transformed with the installation of a zero depth ramp, new tiling and ground rehabilitation. A waterpark playground is currently being constructed at Cootamundra's Swimming Pool, with work expected to be completed in January. New toilet facilities have been installed at the Gundagai Racecourse and Showground. These facilities include disabled toilets and shower facilities. Historical photos have been fitted on the façade and an uncover gazebo constructed to enhance the area. Cootamundra has a new tourism website. The website menu includes a comprehensive list of accommodation sites, things to do and see, eating out, and

what's on guides. The new website address is www.visitcootamundra.com.au. Stan Crowe oval in Gundagai has new lights installed and a new toilet block constructed. The Southside supporters' public amenities have been replaced. The Tigers gym, at the Oval is currently under construction, and will be completed in the near future. Work has commenced on the playgrounds in Jubilee Park in Cootamundra. Gundagai's Carberry Park's Adventure Playground plans have been finalised with earth works commencing next week. The footpath renewal project in Cootamundra is progressing well, with new footpaths installed in Temora Road and Murray Street. Gundagai's stormwater mitigation project has commenced. Other projects include; Muttama Hall; Max Whitteron Memorial Garden; Gundagai Netball Courts Lighting Project; Drainage rehabilitation in Thompson Street laneway Cootamundra; Owen Vincent Oval Carpark Project; Cootamundra Streetscape Beautification; Cootamundra Community Garden Project; Sheridan and West Street Intersection Gundagai; Cemetery Improvement Projects. Many of these projects have been made possible with grants from the NSW State Government, Stronger Communities Fund and Stronger Country Communities Fund. These funds are administered by CGRC.

ORDINARY COUNCIL MEETING

Residents are advised the next Ordinary Meeting of Council will be held on Tuesday 26 November 2019 in the Council Chambers, Gundagai. OPERATIONS REPORT—Shoulder grading and table drain maintenance is currently underway on Dudauman Road. Work has commenced on the drainage improvement on Boundary Road. This work will involve constructing a concrete dish drain along sections of the existing open drain. Work is underway on the extensions to the taxiway at the Cootamundra aerodrome. This work is being done to assist with the refilling of water tankers by the RFS when required for firefighting purposes. Council's resealing contractor Boral has commenced resealing on this years prioritised roads. These roads include: Cullinga, Yeo Yeo Hampstead, Forsyth's and West Jindalee Roads. During the first week of November they are expecting to reseals some Cootamundra town streets. Residents will be notified via letter box drop of those street prior to the resealing.
