equipment. The SCF is an initiative of the NSW State Government and administered by CGRC. The shed will be erected near the permanent volleyball court in Murray Street and will provide an area to store essential items needed for the annual beach volleyball carnival. The Beach Volleyball Committee is made up of volunteers who run the annual Cootamundra beach volleyball festival in February each year. The event has become extremely popular and now hosts 112 teams. ## **GUNDAGAI WATER FILTRATION PLANT MAINTENANCE**

Gundagai's water filtration plant underwent major maintenance work recently require ng the Council to impose level 5 water restrictions on 30 and 31 October. The urgent need to reduce water consumption during the maintenance period was imperative to enable the successful completion of the work. Gundagai residents responded and water consumption over the two days was



drastically reduced and no major issues were encountered during the works. Mayor Abb McAlister said the community should be congratulated on responding to the call. "The maintenance was necessary to replace ageing shafts and impellors in the plants Clarifier, and I'd like to pass on my appreciation to residents for their co-operation during the maintenance period," Cr McAlister said. The Clarifier is the first part of the cleaning of the raw river water, and plays a vital role in the functioning of the plant and delivery of clean potable water.

## NANGUS PUBLIC HALL PROJECT COMPLETE Nangus was abuzz on Friday 3 November

when visitors, dignitaries, residents and local school children attended a function at the Nangus Public Hall to celebrate the recently completed improvements. The hall has seen roller doors installed on the eastern side skillion and a disabled toilet facility with level concrete pathways leading from the hall to public amenities areas completed. Federal member Hon. Michael McCormack MP was in attendance to officially open the roller door project that was made possible with a grant from the Federal Government. Attending in the Mayors absence, Councillor Penny Nicholson presented а plaque commemorate the CGRC and NSW State Government's Stronger Communities Fund grant that enabled the disabled toilet project to go ahead. Cr Nicholson said "It is country halls like this one that are the life blood of our small villages, this is a wonderful project and I'm pleased to have been able to attend this function. This project is a fantastic addition to the hall and ensures equal access for everyone visiting the hall in the future," Cr Nicholson said. The Stronger Communities Fund grant of \$36,527.00 funded the project.

#### **ESSENTIAL ENERGY VEGETATION MANAGEMENT WORKS—GUNDAGAI**

Essential Energy vegetation management works are continuing across the CGRC area. Works in the Cootamundra town are now winding up, with crews beginning the management works in the Gundagai town from Monday 6 November, weather permitting. Essential Energy's cyclical vegetation management program ensures minimum safety clearances are maintained between trees and overhead powerlines and helps to minimise the trimming required in the future, while also maintaining a reliable power supply. Works will be undertaken by Essential Energy approved contractors who are qualified in all aspects of vegetation management. Contractors use directional pruning techniques that remove branches growing towards a powerline and encourage regrowth away from the power network. Whilst this can affect visual amenity, these techniques are considered best practice throughout the arboriculture industry and are used by most power companies in Australia. Budding photographers are encouraged to capture and enter images which capture the essence of the villages of Coolac and Wallendbeen. A winning photo from each village will take home \$100 and that photo will be the cover image for the final strategy. A grand prize of a family photo package or mentor session with Forever Rose Photography will be awarded to an overall winning photo from all six villages. A number of other noted photos will receive judge's prizes such as pool vouchers. #### CONTAINER DEPOSIT SCHEME

The NSW Government's Container Deposit Scheme, known as Return and Earn, is scheduled to commence 1 December 2017 with collection points being installed across the state. Under Return and Earn, most empty 150-millilitre to 3-litre drink containers will be eligible for a 10-cent refund when presented to an approved NSW collection point. There are many ways to participate in Return and Earn, and help the environment and your community. You can continue to use your kerb side recycling service, donating the containers to the local disability support organisation to help fund a wide range of local services. You can take your empty containers to a collection point. Collection points are rolling out from 1 December. You can donate your containers to local charities, schools and community groups to help them fundraise for the works and projects. Councils Director of Operations Ray Graham stated "The operational details of how the local Councils can work in with the NSW Network Operator are not fully understood at this time, but the Councils in the REROC group are working with the Network Operator to try to ensure that a good result is achieved for the communities of the Eastern Riverina." Council has purchased 4 Defibrillators for the Council Chambers, Library, Pool and Sports stadium in Cootamundra and 3 for Gundagai for Council Chambers, Library and Council Depot. Council selected HeartSafe - Adopt-A-Defib as they are a Not for Profit organisation and if one of these units is used the surviving patient is then able to choose another organisation to donate a unit to. # **OPERATIONS REPORT**

<u>CIVIL WORKS</u>—Work on the Gundagai main street project continues to progress. Work on Cowcumbla Street now involves the backfilling and placement of road pavement to bring the levels up to the new causeway height. Earthworks on the widening of Gundagai Road pavement to facilitate turning lanes for traffic into Cowcumbla Street is expected to commence in the next week. This work is

being partially funded by the NSW Government under the Restart NSW funding and Council from the Roads to Recovery Program. Works crews will continue with patches on Gobarralong/Adjungbilly Road to repair failed sections of pavement. Maintenance grading will continue on Finlay's Road and shoulder grading on Berthong and North Berthong Roads. Interflow is progressing on various sections of the Cootamundra Sewer mains with the lining crew, relining prioritised mains and excavating and repairing damaged sections of main which can't easily be relined. All these works will continue for the next few weeks. Stage two of the Temora Street rehabilitation works between Murray Street and Parker Street is scheduled to be recommenced in January. Initial works to replace the water main have already been completed. A contractor has now been engaged to undertake replacement of the kerb and gutter along this section, which will be during January with the pavement reconstruction expected to be undertaken in February. This project is being funded from the Federal Government under the Roads to Recovery program.

TECHNICAL SERVICES—A Tender is currently being advertised for survey design of Adjungbilly Road upgrade. The environmental assessment is underway. Designs have been completed and are currently out to tender for the reconstruction of the bridge. FACILITIES SECTION— Cootamundra outdoor pool is due to open on 18<sup>th</sup> November 2017. Staff have been bury with pool surround pointing, concrete requirements and some

2017. Staff have been busy with pool surround painting, concrete repairs and some tiling being completed. Gundagai pool opened on 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2017. Monday, Wednesday and Friday the pool is open for early morning swimming from 6:30-8:00am. Playground is now open. There is no public use of the 50 metre pool on Thursday from 6:00-7:00 pm to cater for Swim Club events. New park signs were installed in Cootamundra and Wallendbeen. Work has commenced at the old hospital grounds in Cootamundra including

the mowing and whipper snipping of the grounds. A water leak was fixed at Stockinbingal tip and at the Cootamundra Pool

grounds. Damaged tree limbs were removed from a tree on Gundagai road.
