WATER MAINS REPLACEMENT— COOTAMUNDRA


Over the next two years CGRC will be investing \$2 million of monies from the Stronger Communities Fund to expedite Water mains replacement in Cootamundra. Council has commenced a trial of new water bursting technology in Parker Lane. The aim is



to assess the merits of this technology which is expected to minimise disruption to traffic flow and inconvenience to local residents. Pipe bursting is an eco-friendly, trenchless method of replacing buried pipelines without the need for a traditional construction trench. Council has also engaged Goldenfields Water to undertake the replacement of water mains in four residential blocks of Hurley Street in the coming months. This is being undertaken using traditional construction trenching, and utilising available funds within the existing Cootamundra Water Fund as part of programmed on-going water main renewal.

WIN FOR RUGBY CLUB

Cootamundra Rugby Union Club has received a windfall in the form of a grant from Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council's Stronger Communities Fund. Council has identified the club's grounds and infrastructure are in need of major upgrades. Council has set aside \$205,000 from the Stronger Communities Fund major projects program. The project will see the development of a new building that will not only service the needs of the Senior and Junior Rugby Union Clubs but incorporate new toilet facilities for Country Club Oval and provide a building suitable for use by wider community groups. In addition to the Stronger Communities Fund major projects program funding for the amenities building council has allocated a further \$80,000 for new public toilet facilities It is estimated the cost for the project will be \$400,000. The Rugby Club will also be contributing significantly to fund the project. Cootamundra Rugby Union Club is one of the Country's oldest clubs. It has been in existence for approximately 65 years with players and members sourced from the wider community. The formation of a Junior Rugby Union Club at the turn of the century has seen increased player participation including school and external development programs.

OPERATIONS REPORT

Civil Works - Road pavement works are well underway on widening pavement to provide for turning lanes into Cowcumbla Street from Gundagai Road. The new Muttama Creek causeway on Cowcumbla Street is complete with backfilling of the road pavement up to the new causeway height underway. This project is expected to be fully opened to traffic by Christmas. Heavy patching works have been progressing on Gobarralong and Adjungbilly Roads. The first patches have been sealed on Gobarralong Road with the next patches due to be sealed in the coming week. These works are a combination of flood restoration works and general pavement repairs. The majority of the Gundagai work crew is currently undertaking the pavement replacement works in Sheridan Street as part of the main street upgrade. Initial works are concentrating on the top block in order to get it prepared and sealed with as little disruption to the public and businesses as possible. General road patching and other routine maintenance continues to be completed as required on the state highways and shire road network. Recreation - Cootamundra outdoor pool is now open. Opening hours for the summer period are:-18 November 2017 to 11 March 2018–Weekdays 6:30am–8:00am & 9.30am–7:00pm. Weekends and Public Holidays 10.30 am – 6:30 pm. Gundagai pool has been operating for several weeks now. Opening hours for the summer period are: 18 October 2017 to 3 March 2018 -Weekdays 6:30 am – 8:00 am (Mon, Wed, Fri Only) 11.30 am – 6:00 pm Weekends and Public Holidays 11.30 am – 6:00 pm. Parks and Gardens - Work has continued at the back of the old hospital grounds in Cootamundra including the mowing and

whipper snipping. Wallendbeen hall is being cleaned and painted around windows and doors. Cootamundra Parks Staff were able to remove and chip the tree trimmings in Gundagai left by Essential Energy as part of their line clearing operations. The new town entrance park signs have continued to be installed and the sites are being cleaned up. Building Works - Mens Shed -Retaining Wall commenced. Mirrabooka – Concrete footings placed this week for retaining walls installation to commence next week. Roller Doors will be installed after Christmas. Stan Crowe Oval



block work will be complete by end of this week with core filling and placement of roof trusses to be undertaken early next week.



NEW CGRC SIGNAGE Council staff have almost completed the mammoth task of replacing the 76 signs for all town and village entries, parks, ovals, council facilities and buildings across the local government area. In the future the

reverse of the signs will have history panels outlining the significance of the location the sign.
