<u>COMPANION ANIMALS</u> Residents are reminded cats and dogs over **12 weeks** of age OR prior to being sold/given away must be microchipped, this includes working dogs. All cats and dogs must be registered with the Council by the age of **6 months**. This is a lifetime registration fee which stays with the animals for life. Discounted registration fees apply to desexed cats or dogs. A further reminder dogs must be under the effective control of the owner, or whoever is in charge of the animal, at all times. If your dog defecates in a public place or on someone else's property, you must remove the faeces immediately and dispose of them properly - If you fail to pick up after your dog, you or the person in charge of the dog at the time may be liable for a max penalty of \$880

COOTAMUNDRA

OPERATIONS REPORT The extension to the taxiway at the Cootamundra aerodrome is now complete. This work was carried out to assist with the refilling of water tankers by RFS for firefighting purposes. Council's resealing contractor Boral is continuing with resealing on this years prioritised roads. Patching around the bitumen road network is being undertaken as required. Road side spraying and slashing continues around the council area. Works have commenced on relaying pipes for upgrading of the Olympic Highway between Back Brawlin Road and Dirnaseer Road. Several trees have been removed, for safety reasons, as part of the project. Shoulder widening on Yeo Yeo Hampstead Road is progressing with

earthworks now complete. Sealing of these shoulders will take place in early December. This work is funded from the Roads to Recovery program. Work has progressed on concrete lining of the open drain along Boundary Road. The first section between Matilda Avenue and Adams Street has been poured with final headwalls work still to be completed. Heavy patching works are expected to commence early December along sections of the Burley Griffin Way near Stockinbingal. This work has been prioritised by the RMS to remediate failed sections of pavement. While these works are underway, Motorist are asked to obey the directions of the traffic control and may experience short delays. Works are continuing at the intersection of



Sheridan and West Streets; drainage is now complete, concrete kerb and gutter has been installed, shoulders have been filled and asphalt placed.

Preliminary works are in progress at Tor St with services located and design modified in preparation for new kerb and gutter and stormwater drainage installation. Work is nearing completion at O'Hagan St where a 600mm stormwater pipe is being installed to address ongoing issues with localised flooding. The grader and stabiliser crew have completed work at Soldiers Settlers and Sommerset Roads to improve pavement condition and shape. Works is in progress at Bridge St Muttama. Maintenance grading has been

completed at Wambidgee Road, Hoares Lane and is continuing along the Old Hume Highway. Work has recommenced on Adjungbilly Rd with rock lining of table drains continuing in preparation of final stabilisation and sealing prior to Christmas.
