A MESSAGE FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER I take this opportunity to inform and remind residents that information from Council is available to residents in several formats. The first port of call is always the CGRC website. This facility houses the latest media releases, business papers, tenders, position vacant, and documents on public display plus a host of other information for residents to access. Council does host a Facebook page, and I urge all social media users in the region to follow our page, which will keep you up to date with news as it happens. Council issues a number of media releases to local media outlets each week, and we rely on them to report on these. Media outlets have the choice to give us time

and space, however we have a very good relationship with the local newspapers and in most cases our media releases are published. Council meetings are live streamed, and this facility can be accessed through the Council website. Residents can watch the meeting live or at a time that is convenient to them. Council publishes a free newsletter that is delivered to every household and mailing address in the region. Council advertises regularly in the Cootamundra Times and Gundagai Independent, with a half page Snippets notifying residents of items on public display, invitation to submit comments, position vacant and other council business. Council welcomes community comment for presentation to our monthly Council meetings. To adhere to COVID-19 restrictions Council has made provisions for residents to submit feedback via email or letter which are read during the public forum item of the agenda. Council has an exceptional customer service team, who go out of their way to assist people who are requesting information in person or over the phone. Residents have my assurance that Council operates in an open and transparent manner and takes extra steps to ensure the public are informed of all issues that relate to the effective operation of the organisation. Whilst the organisation takes these steps to ensure residents are kept informed, and information is readily available, we can not force people to read or seek this information. HAVE YOUR SAY ON ACTIVE ACCESSIBILITY FOR OUR COMMUNITIES Council is currently undertaking plans for walk ways/cycle ways and mobility routes within the Local Government Area (LGA). The Plans (Bicycle Plan and Pedestrian Access Mobility Plan) are designed to investigate the community's needs in terms of being actively mobile and will encompass bicycle, walkers/joggers and mobility aide users. The aim is to identify existing paths within the region and determine refurbishment, redevelopment and the implementation of new and extended pathways throughout the LGA. Spectators and players alike will be thrilled to see the improvements made at Gundagai's Anzac Park. The entrance way has seen new fencing installed, the old and diseased trees removed, and a new avenue of trees planted. The Southside supporters' amenities block has replaced the porta loo on the southern side of the ground. The new electronic scoreboard has been installed and new concrete retaining walls constructed in the grandstand area. Players will be delighted with the refurbishment of the dressing rooms and the installation of gymnasium

facilities. The buildings within the precinct have been given a fresh coat of paint and fencing completed around the area. The improvements at Anzac Park have been made possible with a \$175,000 Stronger Country Communities Round Two grant.

COVID STIMULUS TO LIGHT UP SHOWGROUNDS

Member for Cootamundra Steph Cooke presented a cheque to Council Facilities Manager Andrew Brock on Wednesday for \$153,203.00. The funds were made available from the NSW State Government COVID-19 stimulus package and will be used to upgrade electrical facilities at the Cootamundra Showground. The grant will be used to undertake important electrical upgrades

which will include the installation of a new solar system, an upgrade to LED lighting at three pavilions, painting and maintenance of the luncheon pavilion.
