SHOPPING LOCALLY ENCOURAGED WITH WHY LEAVE TOWN GIFT CARD PROGRAM

Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council (CGRC) is participating the Why Leave Town (WLT) Gift Card program which provides a unique and convenient gifting solution while also supporting local businesses. CGRC mayor Cr Abb McAlister said the initiative is all about ensuring local people spend their money locally. "Our Council is committed to assisting local business by encouraging locals to participate in the program. It's about locals spending locally, the whole region will benefit. The 'Why Leave Town' gift card helps to trap your dollars in your community increasing the size of the business pie for all," Cr McAlister said. WLT Gift Cards can be purchased and redeemed at any of the participating stores within the CGRC Local Government Area (LGA). That means, if the card is bought at Store A, it can then be redeemed for goods and services at Store A or Store B or Store C and so on. So, with only one purchase you can give a gift that allows the recipient to get exactly what they want from a wide variety of stores. The card, however, can only be redeemed in the Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council area. This means that every time a WLT card is purchased you are supporting your local community. As little as \$1 to as much as \$1000 can be loaded onto a single gift card. The cards are single load only which means that additional amounts cannot be loaded onto the card after the initial purchase. All transactions work through Eftpos machines which means that redeeming goods and services with the WLT Gift Card is the same as making an Eftpos purchase with your bank card. The cards expire 3 years from the time they are loaded. "Shopping local helps to generate local jobs, build local infrastructure and ensure products can be acquired locally." Cr McAlister added.

PUBLIC WORKS UPDATE FOR NOVEMBER: Maintenance Grading has been completed around the Tarrabandra, Bundarbo, Wee Jasper and Willis Rd areas. Crews will be moving towards Brungle Rd and Nanangroe. Culverts are being installed along Brungle Road. Patching works are underway on Adjungbilly and Brungle Roads. Preliminary investigation and drainage works have been completed on Mount and West Streets in preparation of Stabilisation Works. Works have commenced on Nanangroe and Redhill Road including topsoil stripping, drainage and shoulder widening. Town streets culvert cleaning and maintenance is underway. The Cootamundra roads crew are currently concentrating on the Gap Bridge Project as well as repairing damaged culverts on Rosehill Road which were damaged in the February 2019 storm event.

COOTAMUNDRA DRAFT FLOOD STUDY REPORT FOR PUBLIC EXHIBITION - Council has been working with the Floodplain Risk Management Committee and WMAwater to undertake the first stage of the Floodplain Risk Management Process, a Flood Study for Cootamundra. The study identifies flood risk to people, property, infrastructure and assets across the study area, resulting from localised overland flow and large rainfall events over the broader catchment. The study has established a suite of tools and outputs that can assist Council and the community to understand and manage flood risk.
