The seats are an Australian manufactured Sustainable Wood Plastic Composite (WPC) and are durable, low maintenance and environmentally friendly.

Gundagai Lions Club spokesperson Lion Des Manton said the club had allotted many structures to public places over the years. "Our public seating project has been going since 1973, we like to work with Council to identify spaces and provide the structures that the community can use and benefit from," Lion Des said.

WEED MANAGEMENT IS EVERYBODY'S RESPONSIBILITY.

We can all work together to protect our LGA and the unique bushland, swamps and waterways of the Area. Council's obligation. Weeds are plants that do not occur naturally in the bush. They compete with native plants and often dominate or replace them. They degrade and destroy the habitat of our native animals. Under the Biosecurity Act 2015 CGRC as the Local Control Authority has a legal obligation to manage the biosecurity risk posed or likely to be posed to human health, the economy, community, and environment by Priority Weeds. Council meets these obligations through programs to: Control Priority Weeds on Council managed land. Inspect private lands to ensure owners of land carry out their obligations. Council's Biosecurity Regulatory Officers take a co-ordinated approach working with residents, community groups and other agencies.



Your obligation. Under the Biosecurity Act 2015, all landowners or land managers have a 'General Biosecurity Duty' to prevent, eliminate or minimise the Biosecurity Risk posed or likely to be posed by Priority Weeds. What is a Priority Weed? Priority Weeds or Biosecurity Matter can impact on human health, the economy, the liveability of our city and the environment. Impacts can include allergies and other health issues, costs of control, loss of tourism value, degradation of natural landscapes, parks and recreation facilities, reduction of useful agricultural land and loss of primary production, loss of biodiversity and water quality. OTWAY AND SHERIDAN STREET UPGRADE

Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council (CGRC) is currently undertaking an upgrade of the Otway and Sheridan Street intersection in Gundagai. The upgrade will replace the damaged kerb and gutter and pavement. The design phase has identified trees within the upgrade area will be removed due to disease, pest infestation and have caused damage to the existing pavements and kerb and guttering.

The existing trees have been categorised as a potential high risk safety hazard to pedestrians, vehicles, and infrastructure. As part of the redevelopment of this area, staff will create new garden beds and plant appropriate mature trees in accordance with the Gundagai Street Tree Master Plan.

COOTAMUNDRA SWIM CLUB HOSTS SISA SWIM CHAMPIONSHIPS AND SPEEDO SPRINTS.

On 6 & 7 February 2021, Cootamundra Swimming Lifesaving Club hosted the 2020/2021 Southern Inland Swimming Association (SISA) Long Course Championships and Speedo Sprints for the Region.
