EXCITING NEW FUTURE AHEAD FOR GUNDAGAI PRESCHOOL KINDERGARTEN:

Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council (CGRC), in conjunction with Gundagai Preschool Kindergarten Inc are excited that plans have now reached the stage, where tenders are being called for the redevelopment of the Preschool.

Months of planning, and consultation with Council and Preschool members have resulted in plans being drafted to see this exciting new redevelopment take place.

CGRC is now seeking suitably qualified contractors to undertake construction at the Gundagai Preschool Kindergarten. The project is to be undertaken in two stages. This is required to allow early childcare and preschool activities to continue uninterrupted and safely during the redevelopment.

Stage 1 will see substantial earthworks, a carpark, and a new preschool building constructed, with staff and children moving to the new building before Stage 2 commences. Stage 2 will see the existing preschool building demolished before final buildings will be constructed. The successful contractor will need to work closely with preschool staff to ensure minimal interruption and safety to staff, children and families.

Once complete, the Preschool will provide up to 80 places for quality preschool education to children 3yrs to school-age, as well as a vital therapy room for children and families who require inclusion and support services. The design includes 3 age-appropriate playrooms, all with separate bathrooms and change areas, a staff room, a dedicated kitchen and dining area where children and educators can take part in interactive cooking experiences. As well as providing preschool education, 1 of the playrooms will offer a therapy space to cater for inclusion services such as occupational therapists, speech pathologists, parenting classes and early childhood courses. The new facility will ensure every child in the community has access to a quality preschool program, 2 years before formal schooling.

The new facility will support growth within the community, activate the local economy, and improve services and community infrastructure. It is vital the project remains on budget and construction falls within allocations. This project would not be possible without the support of NSW Strong Capital Works Program. The tender closes at 2pm, Friday 8 October 2021 with contracts expected to be signed early in November 2021.

CGRC mayor Cr Abb McAlister said he was pleased the final plans have come together. "We've reached the first milestone in what will be a great future development for the Preschool. Council staff along with stakeholders from the preschool have worked together to ensure that the future needs of Gundagai's preschool aged children are met," Cr McAlister said.

This project would not be possible without the support of NSW Strong Capital Works Program and the NSW Stronger Communities Funding Program.



NEW SEATS AND SHADE SHELTER Gundagai's Friendship Park, has undergone further improvements, with the installation of security fencing, seating and a shade shelter, with picnic facilities. The neighbourhood park has seen new playground equipment installed recently. The new seating and shade shelter will make the area a haven for children and carers. The playground now has the infrastructure to be an ideal venue for birthday parties and other neighbourhood celebrations. Funding for the improvements at Friendship Park have been made possible from the NSW State **Governments Stronger Country** Communities Fund.

CGRC COMMUNITY NEWSLETTER LATE EDITION

Council apologises to residents that the Community Newsletter was not delivered in the first week of the month, as per the normal arrangement. The late delivery is due to Australia Post's commitment to the Census and results of the COVID-19 pandemic with staff shortages and restrictions. The normal delivery of the Newsletter will resume in October 2021. CIVIL WORKS: Fixing Local Roads Projects: McKay Street Cootamundra works are completed on the kerb from Onley Street to Hemet Crescent. Footpath reinstatement has commenced at the Poole Street intersection, due to Covid restrictions the contractor has been limited with work abilities. Installation of new culvert at the intersection of Onlev Street is expected to be completed soon. The next stage will be pavement rehabilitation in the blocks between Onley and Hemet Crescent. All pavement material on Old Gundagai Road has now been placed and compacted. The next stage of the sealing works will start in warmer conditions. Work will recommence on the Old Hume Highway with gravel resheeting and drain clearing to resume ahead of planned stabilisation and sealing.

<u>Local Roads Community Infrastructure</u> <u>Program</u>: Works on the bridge replacement on Rosehill Road, Cootamundra have seen the all the ancillary drainage works alongside the road completed and the removal of the side-track. Pavement construction of the bridge approaches is underway. While the road is open to traffic, bitumen sealing is expected to take place in early September 2021. This project was being funded from the Local Roads Community Infrastructure program as well as some funds from the Natural Disaster funds from the February 2019 storm event.

<u>Wallendbeen Railway Bridge:</u> Advice was recently received for John Holland Rail (JHR) regarding the expected opening of the temporary bridge over the railway line is now mid-November 2021. Concern has been raised with Transport for NSW (TfNSW) regarding this date due to the extra burden and impact this will have on Council's local road network in particular Stockinbingal Road. TfNSW have advised they are in negotiation with JHR to review at this date to bring it forward early October 2021. JHR are currently assembling the temporary bridge with plans underway to commence construction of the bridge abutments shortly.

Stockinbingal Road Cootamundra: Council is in discussions with TfNSW to cover the additional maintenance on Stockinbingal Road with a positive outcome expected. These discussions include the need for additional heavy patching and pavement rehabilitation due to the severity of the damage being experienced. Works: Works are complete on the side-track over the Bongolong Creek on Burra Road, Burra Creek. This was emergency works to provide access to local traffic only with a 5 tonne limit imposed. Preparation works are under way to advertise for the replacement of this structure. Maintenance grading has been completed on Hopewood, Bundarbo, Wee Jasper, Fairview and Cooneys Creek Roads, Jugiong. Gravel Resheeting has been completed on Rosedale Road, Mundarlo. Grading crews will continue onto Cooininee, Hoares, Tabers, Armours, Wambidgee Roads, Coolac, Deltroit and Reef Creek Roads, Mundarlo.

<u>COUNCIL MEETING NOTES:</u> At the Ordinary meeting held 31 August 2021 Council resolved:

RES 180/2021: To have Pioneer Park, Cootamundra be included in a new RV Friendly Town Assessment submission to the Campervan and Motorhome Club of Australia (CMCA) to have Cootamundra included in the Recreational Vehicle Friendly Town program by submitting a new application to CMCA for approval of the determined sites. On approval the new RV Friendly site will be advertised through Councils usual mediums and RV Friendly Town signs will be installed.

RES 221/2021: The Ordinary Meeting scheduled for 14 December 2021 is to be cancelled. It was resolved to hold an Ordinary Meeting 10 January 2022, being no later than three weeks after election results have been declared as legislated under the Local Government Act.

RES 235/2021: Council will endorse the Bushfire Black Summer Reovery Grant for \$122,000 for the Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Entrepreneurs Program.

RES 236/2021: Council adopted the Draft Child Protection Policy and Procedure.

RES 237/2021: Council consider entering into a Memorandum of Understanding with Paranormal Entertainment (trading as APPI Ghost Hunts & Tours) to conduct tours at the Old Gundagai Gaol.

RES 239/2021: Council approved the PROPOSED 4MW SOLAR FARM - LOT 8 DP 1244273,167 FIVE MILE CREEK ROAD, GUNDAGAI subject to consent conditions.

RES 240/2021: Council approved the CHANGE OF USE TO DENTAL CLINIC, 2-4 COOPER STREET, COOTAMUNDRA -VARIATION TO DEVELOPMENT STANDARD subject to the consent conditions.
