GUNDAGAI LIBRARY UPDATE – Gundagai library hours have resumed to normal opening times of Monday to Friday 9.00am-12.30 and 1.30-5.00pm. Story time and other group activities have not recommenced due to the Covid-19 situation and the high number of highway travellers in and around the library. This situation will be monitored.

COOTAMUNDRA INDOOR POOL OPEN WITH RESTRICTED NUMBERS SWIMMING BY BOOKING ONLY - The pool will be operating with a COVID safe plan. Bookings will be required for Pool access. Phone 0448187279 for bookings. No booking No Access. Opening Hours are: Monday - Friday 6.30am - 8am, 11.30am - 2pm, 5pm - 7pm (6pm Thursdays), W/ends 9am - 12 noon. Each booking will have allocated time slots and time limits. Bathrooms are not available for use, bring your own swimming equipment. Only 2 lap swimmers per lane are permitted. Numbers are strictly limited to 10 people at any time, excluding the lifeguard. The above mentioned will be strictly enforced to ensure everyone is given equitable time and treatment.

RE-ESTABLISHMENT OF COOTAMUNDRA BAND S355 COMMITTEE – Call for committee members. At the June 2020 Meeting. Council reversed its January 2020 decision to abandon the previous Committee. All interested residents, not just band members, are invited to apply for committee membership. The committee provides a mechanism by which any interested persons can have an active role in the management of the band on behalf of Council. Applications received, and a revised committee Charter and date for an inaugural Annual General Meeting to elect a committee executive, will be considered at the August 2020 Council meeting.

PUBLIC WORKS - Burra Rd has been stabilised with sealing to be completed in the next week. Culvert Replacement is continuing Nanangroe and Redhill Roads. Gravel resheeting is in progress in the Tumblong area. Crews will be working around the Muttama area including Finlays Lane. Maintenance grading is continuing with works completed including Rosedale and Parsons Creek Roads. The concrete sleeper retaining wall at Anzac Park has been completed, concrete staff are working on stairs at the Water Treatment Plant. The new banner poles have been installed in Sheridan Street Gundagai and Parker Street Cootamundra. Kerb and gutter replacement is nearing completion in Merle Avenue and O'Donnell Street. The pavement reconstruction on Old Gundagai Road has now been sealed and will be linemarked as soon as possible. This project is Roads to Recovery Project. General maintenance including patching and sign replacement is being undertaken around the whole LGA area. Private works are continuing on the Boundary Road Sub-division.

JUBILEE PARK CONCEPT PLAN - was undertaken with the assistance of Sala4D, Landscape Architects to create a landscape masterplan. The Concept Plan puts forward many ideas and impressions for consideration. These ideas may be embraced or declined by a community. The result of the two community workshops held demonstrated there was overwhelming support to further enhance and expand on the native theme including plants and wildlife (birds) in particular. A Facebook survey is seeking public opinion on the concept of introducing native plants and trees into the landscape to entice native wildlife to the area. The proposed development is Integrated Development under Section 4.46 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act, 1979 and the following approvals are required from those relevant approval bodies specified: an activity approval under Section 91 of the Water Management Act 2000. The development application and accompanying documentation are available for public inspection, free of charge, for a **period 28 days, between 9 July and 5 August 2020** on Council's website: www.cgrc.nsw.gov.au.
