



FOOTPATH REPLACEMENT: Council will commence work on the replacement of the footpath along Muttama Creek between Mackay and Thompson Streets Cootamundra. Project is funded by Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program. The existing footpath will be closed to pedestrians for approximately 4 weeks. Pedestrians detour via Mackay-Thompson Street or any other preferable routes during the construction time.

NOTICE TO MOTORISTS: Temporary Road Closure - Red Hill Road Gundagai - From 7 February 2022. There is a need to close a section of Red Hill Road whilst Forestry Corporation NSW undertake harvesting operations to ensure the safety of both workers and road users.
