**ORDINARY COUNCIL MEETING:** To be held on Tuesday 18 October at the Alby Schultz Meeting Centre, Cooper St Cootamundra. Commencing and livestreamed at 6pm. Members of the public may address Council on matters related to an associated agenda item only, as part of the Public Forum.

**FOOTPATH PROJECT:** Work has commenced this week, on a new footpath in Sutton St, Cootamundra (weather permitting). While these works are underway, the carparking on the western side of Sutton St will be closed, in sections between the Mackay & Hurley St intersections. Pedestrians will be required use footpaths on the eastern side of Sutton St, or other preferred paths for the duration of works. Parking may not be available in this area.

**SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS ON TIMBER RAIL VIADUCT ON OI BELL DRIVE GUNDAGAI:** Transport for NSW will carry out maintenance and safety improvement work to the timber rail viaduct in Gundagai in September and October. Work will be carried out on sections of the viaduct along OI Bell Drive and Middleton Drive to improve safety for transport customers. Recent heavy rainfall and flooding has caused sections of the historic bridge to deteriorate. The work will reduce the risk of falling debris and allow vehicles and pedestrians to safely travel under the bridge. Traffic changes along OI Bell Drive will be in place for the duration of the work. Stop signs at either side of the underpass on OI Bell Drive has been installed with other signage advising transport customers of potential falling debris. Transport is working quickly and in consultation with Council to carry out this work.

The aim of the Road Safety Action Plan is to improve the overall safety of the users of CGRC's road network to reduce road trauma and the impacts on the community. Council has adopted the Safe Systems model approach to Road Safety by inclusively catering for all groups using the road system, and seeks to actively educate the surrounding community and visitors by promoting safer speeds, safer travel, and safer road user behaviour.
