EXTRAORDINARY COUNCIL MEETING: Will be held on 10 January at the Gundagai Council Chambers, starting at 6pm. Livestreaming of the meeting will commence at 6.00pm.

TRANSFER STATION UPGRADE:

Council will be implementing upgrades to existing Waste Transfer Stations around the villages of Muttama, Coolac, Nangus and Tumblong. New electronic and surveillance systems are being installed. Once the infrastructure installation has been completed, Council will commence the formal change over. The intention is to have a gradual transition over to the new system, taking about 3 months to complete. Council will be contacting the existing Waste Transfer Station key holders to arrange the exchange. Once this has been completed, applications for new access swipe cards will be advertised and relevant Council services provided to service the demand.
