A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR:

The announcement that CGRC has been successful in receiving grants from the Federal Government's Black Summer Bushfire Recovery Grants program will see some exciting projects delivered to the LGA. Federal member for Riverina Michael McCormack made the announcement that three local projects funded were:

- Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Entrepreneurs' Program. This project consists of three streams. 1 Acceleration for promising existing businesses (including embracing new business models); 2. Incubation for intenders or very early businesses; 3. Project Development to encourage the business community to band together to build business cases to deliver new capability.
- Cootamundra-Gundagai Youth Strategy Implementation. This project will ensure the on-going employment of a Youth & Inclusion Officer for CGRC focused on implementing the Cootamundra-Gundagai Youth Strategy, supporting Youth Councils in Cootamundra & Gundagai and strengthening Council's relationship with a wide range of community groups including indigenous groups and disability advocates.

Young people in the LGA have flagged mental as a key issue of concern. The Youth Strategy focuses on creating spaces, events and activities that enable young people to create community connections where they can receive informal advice and support for challenges that don't warrant (or aren't perceived to warrant) formal counselling or therapy.

• Old Gundagai Heritage Trail and Murrumbidgee River Access project will provide a 1.5km loop trail and augmented reality experience to allow visitors to Gundagai to experience the Old Gundagai Town, the Bora Ring and the great flood of 1852 including the heroic rescues by the Wiradjuri men. The project will also develop a River Access point to interpret the Historic River Crossing onto the Murrumbidgee at North Gundagai including a boat ramp and pontoon, viewing platform and parking areas.

Detailed design work is underway, for Claron Estate in Cootamundra where it is proposed for 100 lot residential subdivision be established.

The all inclusive playspace in Cootamundra's Albert Park is taking shape, with expected construction to be completed by the end of March 2022. Weather permitting.
