Unique Gift For Bradman Birthplace Museum

Above: A genuine piece of history has been donated to Cootamundra's Bradman's Birthplace Museum. A signed bat by cricketing legend Sir Donald Bradman, was handed over by Sydney man Matthew Donnellan. The piece is extremely unique, as the bat has also been signed by English bowler Harold Larwood. The Don's adversary during the 1932-33 Test Series, commonly known as the "Bodyline Series". Larwood emigrated to Australia in 1950. Members of the Bradman Birthplace Museum volunteers and CGRC mayor Cr Charlie Sheahan were on hand to take delivery of the large, framed bat, that contains pictures of the pair and memorabilia.


