**DAMAGE TO BRIDGE FORCES PARTIAL ROAD CLOSURE:** Motorists and residents in the Parsons Creek Road area will be diverted around the Mud Wall Creek bridge using a temporary side-track, due to the bridge being damaged. The bridge infrastructure has been inspected by CGRC staff and engineers and deemed unsafe for traffic to use. A temporary detour is in place for local and light traffic only. The detour is not suitable for heavy vehicles. Council staff erected electronic signboard, notifying road users of the conditions. The Mud Wall Creek bridge is at the Nanangroe Road end of Parsons Creek Road in the Adjungbilly area. CGRC staff will be conducting further investigations on the damage with further notifications to come on a longer-term solution for heavy vehicle access.

**LED STREETLIGHT PROJECT:** Work to upgrade 960 streetlights to energy efficient technology will begin this week as part of a major energy efficiency project that will save hundreds of thousands in electricity bills and reduce greenhouse gas emissions for the ratepayers of Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council (CGRC). The switch to LED technology will see a 247 MWh per year reduction in power use, delivering savings of approximately \$60,000 each year in maintenance and electricity costs.
