HAVE YOUR SAY ON PEDESTRIAN ACCESS AND MOBILITY PLAN (PAMP)

The Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council (CGRC) PAMP will align with Council's key principles and objectives identified in the 2022 Community Strategic Plan by achieving pathway network infrastructure and maintenance that respects community expectations and needs. It will provide the framework for developing pedestrian routes or areas identified as important for walkability, safety, convenience and mobility, with a particular focus on footpaths, kerb ramps and crossing facilities at critical locations. The CGRC PAMP will be used to guide investment in safe, convenient and connected pedestrian infrastructure. It is the key instrument for planning and building needed pedestrian infrastructure in a prioritised manner. It is essential in supporting all major pedestrian funding requests directed through Transport for NSW (TfNSW) and will ensure that all available funding sources are being used effectively to improve the pedestrian network. Community consultation and feedback is important in the development of this PAMP and Council thanks you for your participation.

APPLICATIONS FOR THE LOCAL HERITAGE GRANTS 2022/2023 ARE NOW OPEN:

A local heritage grant program has been established by Council with the aid of funding support from NSW Government. The aim of the program is to encourage the conservation of heritage items within the Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council Local Government Area (LGA) and promote a positive community attitude to heritage conservation. Generally, the level of funding per project will be \$1,000, with a maximum amount of \$5,000 for a major project, however, due to the competitive nature of the program, Council may offer funding less than the requested amount. Payment of grants will not be made until the project is complete and a final report from Council's heritage advisor is received. Applicants will be required to provide at least matching finance for the projects. Applications close - 9.30am Monday 22 August 2022. Notifications to Applicants - September 2022.
