ORDINARY COUNCIL MEETING HELD 27 SEPT 2022: Council endorsed the CGRC Road Safety Action Plan 2022-2026. The Road Safety Action Plan 2022-2026 is Council's fiveyear plan for the delivery of road safety outcomes in the CGRC area. The aim of the Road Safety Action Plan is to improve the overall safety of the users of CGRC's road network to reduce road trauma and the impacts on the community. Council has adopted the Safe Systems model approach to Road Safety by inclusively catering for all groups using the road system, and seeks to educate actively the surrounding community and visitors by promoting safer speeds, safer travel, and safer road user behaviour.



SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS ON TIMBER RAIL VIADUCT OI BELL DRIVE GUNDAGAI: Transport for NSW will carry out maintenance and safety improvement work to

the timber rail viaduct in Gundagai in September and October. Work will be carried out on sections of the viaduct along OI Bell Drive and Middleton Drive to improve safety for transport customers._Recent heavy rainfall and flooding has caused sections of the historic bridge to deteriorate.

The work will reduce the risk of falling debris and allow vehicles and pedestrians to safely travel under the bridge. Traffic changes along OI Bell Drive will be in place for the duration of the work. Stop signs at either side of the underpass on OI Bell Drive has been installed with other signage advising transport customers of potential falling debris. Transport is working quickly and in consultation with Council to carry out this work.



SAFETY ISSUES RAISED BY BUS OPERATORS

CGRC's Road Safety Officer (RSO), Kylie Grybaitis conducted meetings in Cootamundra and Gundagai, with local school bus operators. Ms Grybaitis was keen to meet with bus operators to discuss the Draft School Bus Route and Bus Stop Policy. The policy formulated to provide Council with means to assess requests and consistently and objectively for rural school bus routes and bus stops. The draft policy was given to operators for their feedback before it is presented to the CGRC Traffic Committee for adoption.

Operators were also informed of funding opportunities with the Country Passenger Transport Infrastructure (CPTIGS).

Bus operators, raised concerns about safety, particularly around schools and irresponsible parents/carers, who were parking illegally and dangerously whilst dropping off or picking up students. One operator stated it was just a matter of time, before a serious if not fatal incident occurred. Other issues raised in the meetings included road maintenance at informal bus stops, overhanging branches on trees, safe turning zones and negotiating narrow streets.

Council is striving to have the process completed in three months. We are working closely with the Office for Local Government who are assisting and giving advice as we move along. Council will keep you updated as the process continues.

DRIVE TO THE CONDITIONS, SLOW DOWN AND THINK ABOUT YOUR TRIP.

Recent wet weather and emergency events have caused significant damage to all roads within the CGRC LGA.

Council crews are working hard to access damage, prioritise safety and deploying resources when conditions permit and where the need is greatest. Recent and ongoing rain events have caused numerous washouts and debris in causeways.

Motorists are asked to use extreme caution when travelling on roads and causeways impacted by flood and storms.

Most causeways have the appropriate warnings indicating water depths however motorist should not drive through flooded causeways due to the unknown condition of the flooded causeway and speed of water.

Council wastes valuable resources repairing damage done by vehicles using closed or wet roads. Motorists can assist by using alternate routes, refrain from driving on unsealed roads if the trip is unnecessary during wet weather.

Motorists are advised to travel according to the road conditions at all times, and please refrain from travelling on closed roads.
