

BE A RESPONSIBLE PET OWNER:

A reminder that under the NSW Companion Animals Act, dogs must be kept on a leash in all public places. Except in designated off leash parks. Owners caught with dogs off leash may be issued with penalty infringement notice of \$330.

Pet owners are reminded to clean up after your dog. Disposable bags are available across most parks and public places, and dog walkers are encouraged to always have the bags with them. A hefty \$275 fine can be incurred for failing to immediately dispose of faeces. Enquires call Council on 1300 459 689.

CYCLEWAY SURVEY NOW AVAILABLE:

Residents are invited to participate in the Cycleway Survey now online via Council's website and Facebook page. The survey will determine where the community wants to see destinations that can be accessed by cycleways. What roads are most popular with cyclists and priority destinations identified by cyclists that need to be accessed. The survey will assist with education needs across the Local Government Region (LGA), as identified by survey participants. Paper copies of the survey are also available at Council's Administration Centres in Cootamundra and Gundagai.

SHERWOOD FOREST GETS MAKEOVER:

Stage 1 of the Sherwood Forest masterplan works this week.

The rejuvenation of the highly valued park will eventually see an area that residents and visitors can enjoy, with an abundance of native flora planted and nurtured to attract native birds and wildlife.

Consultation with the Gundagai community uncovered a desire to keep the park simple, provide colourful planting to enhance the walking experience through the site, provide opportunities for nature play and picnic settings. A pathway throughout the park was high on the agenda of community wishes, due to its location to the CBD of Gundagai, Morleys Creek and other recreational areas in close proximity.

As work begins access to the area will be restricted, and detours in place. Some exotic trees will be removed, to make way for walking paths and essential earthworks to be undertaken.

The site provides important cultural history to the local area, former cattle yards, and there is a desire for this history to be interpreted through signage.

OFFICE OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT DEMERGER UPDATE:

The NSW Government supports the deamalgamation of Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council, recognising the right of local councils and communities to make fully informed decisions on matters affecting their own future.

Minister for Local Government, Ron Hoenig has met with the mayor of Cootamundra-Gundagai to discuss the demerger and the Government will continue to engage closely with the council regarding the process.

There is no recent precedent for demerging a council in NSW and the Minister is currently considering a range of options to address the challenges facing Cootamundra-Gundagai.

The Government will continue to provide updates to the community on the demerger as they are available.

FROM THE MAYOR:

As the Mayor of our wonderful Council area, I would like to inform all landowners, builders, and developers that Australia wide, the nation is experiencing a housing shortage. This is driving up house prices and rents right across the country.

Currently here in our local government area there is next to no rental accommodation available in Cootamundra and Gundagai. With the proposed opening of the abattoirs in Cootamundra, the construction of inland rail from Illabo to Stockinbingal, Hume Link and Jeremiah Wind Farm, there will be an increasing demand for accommodation in our region.

We are also experiencing a shortage in healthcare and age care workers providing the need for further accommodation to attract and fill these positions.

I acknowledge that private developers are bringing new housing lots onto the market with more in the pipeline. including council land which will meet medium to longer term needs for growth and provide for a more integrated workforce. However, the current situation is providing a great opportunity for anyone with vacant property in residential zoned areas to consider developing for residential accommodation. The time to do this could not be better than now. I urge anyone who has vacant land or buildings with a view to develop, to reach out to Council and sit down with our planning staff for advice on progressing your plans to best take advantage of the current opportunity.
