

Road resurfacing work on Olympic Highway near Cootamundra

October 2023



Transport for NSW acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

Transport for NSW is planning to carry out road resurfacing work and safety barrier installation on the Olympic Highway to provide a safer and smoother road between Cootamundra and Wallendbeen.

What work are we doing?

A three-kilometre section of the Olympic Highway will be resurfaced to provide a safer and more accessible highway for road users. Installing new safety barrier and linemarking is also part of the work. This section of road has been under a reduced speed limit for about 18 months. When the work is complete, the speed limit will return to 100 km/h.

When and where we'll be working

The road resurfacing work will be carried out across six weeks, weather permitting.

We'll be working on the Olympic Highway between Cootamundra and Wallendbeen, near the highway's intersection with Old Gundagai Road, from **Tuesday 31 October to Friday 15 December 2023**, weather permitting.

Work hours are between **7am and 6pm Monday to Saturday**.

What will this mean for you?

Motorists should plan their journey and allow an extra five minutes travel time.

You may notice:

- access to some properties will be affected
- workers and vehicles
- traffic controllers and signage
- single lane closures and reduced speed limits
- noise from machinery and equipment.

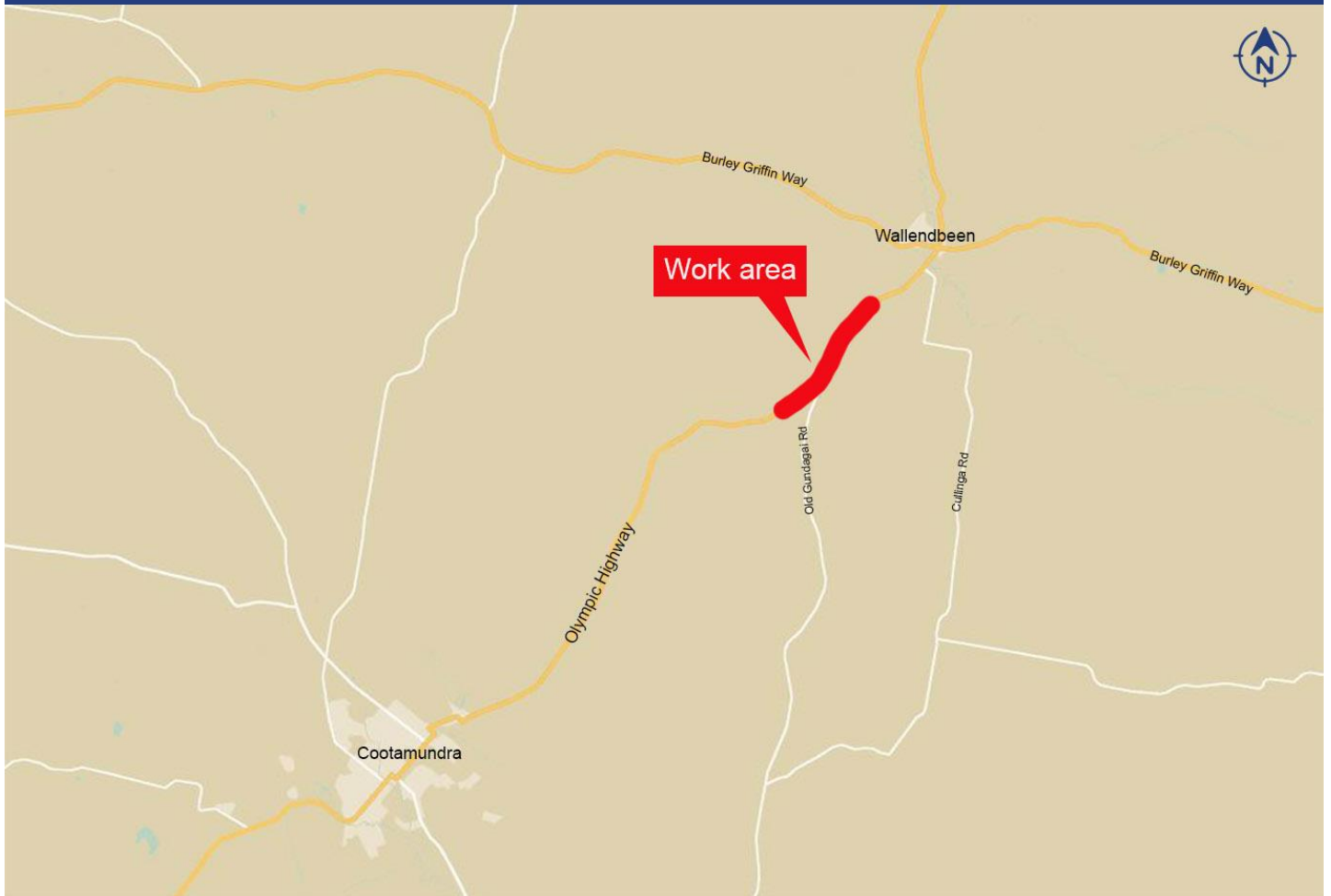
Access to properties
