GUNDAGAI VILLAGES FLOOD STUDY:

CGRC is seeking input from local residents for the Gundagai Villages Flood Study. Council has recently engaged flooding consultants HydroStorm Consulting to undertake a flood study for the villages Coolac, Nangus, Tumblong, Darbalara and those residing in the Murrumbidgee floodplain outside Gundagai. The flood study aims to explore and assess flooding in these areas and as such local community input is crucial for better understanding and addressing potential flood risks in these communities. Engaging with the community serves the dual purpose of keeping the community informed about the project's progress and provide an avenue for residents to share information about their past experience with flood.

TEMPORARY BUS ZONE GUNDAGAI VIC:

The establishment of an additional temporary bus parking zone beside the existing public toilet block has been implemented for the duration of the Gundagai Tourist/ Visitor information centre building works. The building works along with the increase in bus movements in the area has led to congestion, so a temporary bus zone was required to improve safety. The building works are expected to be completed by August and it is expected that the new parking conditions will be in place until the refurbished Visitor Information Centre is opened to the public.

COMPANION ANIMAL AUDIT:

CGRC will be undertaking an audit of the NSW Companion Animal Register of cats that are not desexed, not registered and require an annual permit.

The NSW Government introduced in July 2020, annual permits for non-desexed cats as part of its commitment to promoting responsible pet ownership and improving animal welfare standards. This requires Owners of non-desexed cats to pay an annual fee in addition to their one-off lifetime pet registration.

The annual permit is \$92 **plus** their registration fee \$65. The registration remains a one of payment however the permit must be paid yearly.

In NSW, all cats and dogs, must be registered by 6 months of age, this includes all working dogs.

The registration fee is a one-off payment, paid at Council Offices and covers your pet for its lifetime, regardless of any changes in ownership. Owners are responsible for changing details when pets are sold or given away. If your pet has died, you must also notify the Council within 28 days of its death.
