FEEDBACK REQUEST FOR COWBOY STATUE:

Cootamundra-Gundagai Regional Council (CGRC) is calling on residents to provide feedback on a proposal to commission a life-sized statue honouring legendary local cowboy, Mr Bob Holder.

Commissioning a statue in Mr Holder's honour was considered as a unique opportunity for CGRC to pay tribute to a living legend who has represented Cootamundra with distinction. This tribute would act as a permanent recognition of his lifetime of achievement and character, cementing his legacy in the heart of the community that shaped him.

CGRC mayor Cr Abb McAlister said the proposal aligns with how CGRC has recognised other icons and the benefits of such a project are significant.

"I urge residents to participate in the community feedback sort for this project, honouring Bob not only celebrates his extraordinary achievements it also recognises what makes Cootamundra truly special," Cr McAlister said.

REVEGETATING MORELY'S CREEK:

Gundagai locals will be noticing a lot or work being undertaken along the Morely's Creek precinct.

The revegetating of the creek is being co-ordinated by Local Land Services and has continued with the Brungle Tumut Local Aboriginal Land Council work team undertaking a planting day along the creek between the Otway Street and the Sherwood Forest works.

The planting of native, mainly understorey vegetation to the banks of the creek will benefit the biodiversity and habitat recovery to the area.

Local school students have undertaken another planting session in the vicinity of the Morely's Creek Pontoon.

The project is being undertaken with the assistance of The Refreshing Rivers program that is addressing land use and land management issues in a number of ways, working hand-in-hand with landholders, partnering with community organisations, and connecting to national sustainability and stewardship schemes.

CRICKET NETS FOR BUDDING STARS:

CGRC in a partnership with the Gundagai Cricket club have commenced works to replace the old cricket nets at the Stan Crowe Oval precinct.

New posts and chain wire netting have been installed. The forming and preparation for the pouring of the concrete base slab has commenced.

The partnership was formed to deliver new practice nets to meet the clubs demands into the future.

Funding for new nets was secured through Council's Capital works budget allocation of \$27,500 and a co- contribution to the project of \$27,500 from the Gundagai Cricket Club. The completion of the new nets is due to be completed prior to the commencement of the 2026 cricket season.

WHAT'S THIS:

It's a fatberg and is a congealed pile of wet wipes, fats and other rubbish that accumulate in sewer mains and become a hard solid mass. They cause a back flow of sewage that leads to sewage overflows blocking the sewage system or lead to a backflow of sewage into households.
