



ORDINARY COUNCIL MEETING:

Will be held on **Tues 25 Aug 2026** commencing at **6pm** in the Alby Schultz Meeting Centre, Cooper St Cootamundra. Refer to Council's website for business paper.

ROAD WORKS:

Drainage construction works along Olney Street, Cootamundra. **Work hours will be 7:00am to 5pm Monday to Friday & 7am to 3pm Saturday.** Temporary traffic control & minor delays may occur.

FIRE HYDRANT INSPECTION & MAINTENANCE PROGRAM:

Council is undertaking a fire hydrant inspection & maintenance program across Cootamundra, Gundagai. More than **1,200 hydrants** will be tested, flushed & maintained to help ensure a safe & reliable water supply. Residents may notice temporary water discolouration during flushing. If this occurs, run a cold tap for a few minutes until the water clears.

PROPOSED CONTROL BURN – GUNDAGAI AREA:

Murrumbidgee Landcare Incorporated, in partnership with Gundagai Bushcare Group & Dean Freeman (Local Land Services Cultural Burn Officer & Gugga Collective representative), has applied to conduct an ecological burn on Council-managed land below the Mt Parnassus Lookout. A draft burn plan & mapping have been prepared & lodged in consultation with Fire & Rescue NSW. The burn is proposed for **Friday, 21 August**, weather permitting, as a demonstration of First Nations land management practices to support ecological outcomes. Residents near Mt Parnassus & North Gundagai may notice increased vehicle activity & smoke during the burn.

ROAD CLOSED: ADAMS STREET COOTAMUNDRA:

Adams Street between Cutler Avenue & Northcott Avenue is closed to all traffic due to safety concerns over the deteriorating causeway. The closure is expected to remain in place for **approximately six months** while repair works are completed. Vehicles under 4 tonnes should use the detour via **Cutler Avenue & Northcott Avenue.**

RURAL ROAD SAFETY MONTH:

The need for safer roads remains critical. **In 2025, 236 people were killed on rural & regional NSW roads, which was 17 more lives lost than in 2024.** Every fatality is a tragedy that affects families, workplaces & entire communities. Rural Road Safety Month reminds us that even small changes in driver behaviour can make a significant difference in preventing crashes & saving lives.
